This guide introduces you to the features and functions of your new phone. Also included are safety precautions you should be aware of, so please read this guide first before you begin using your new phone.



Do not block the area around the ambient light and proximity sensor. If you attach a protective film to the screen, make sure it does not block the sensor.


Buttons

\leftarrow	Return	 Touch to return to the previous screen or exit the current application. When you are entering text, touch to hide the onscreen keyboard.
	Home	Touch to return to the home screen.
=	Menu	Touch to display an option menu.Touch and hold to display the list of recently used applications.

Charging the battery

To charge the phone, you can:

- Use the provided USB cable and power adapter to connect your phone to an electric socket.
- Use a USB cable to connect your phone to a computer, then touch **Charge only** on the **USB connection methods** screen.



Battery indicator

The battery indicator shows your phone's battery level.

- Blinking red: The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady red (when charging): The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady yellow (when charging): The battery level is higher than 10%.
- Steady green (when charging): The battery is almost or already full.

Important information about the battery

- Rechargeable batteries have a limited lifecycle and may eventually need to be replaced. If you notice significantly reduced battery life, replace the battery.
- Your phone may get hot if it has been on for a long period of time, especially in hot environments. If your phone is too hot, stop using it and unplug it from any power source to let it cool down. Do not hold the phone for long periods to avoid burn injuries.
- Use the original power adapter and USB cable to charge your phone. Using third-party accessories may reduce your phone performance or be hazardous. Do not operate your phone or cover it or the power adapter while your phone is charging.
- The time required to fully charge the battery depends on the ambient temperature and age of the battery.
- If your phone is very low on power, it plays an alert tone and displays a
 message. If the battery level is extremely low, your phone automatically
 turns off.
- If the battery is completely empty, your phone may not turn on immediately when you begin to charge the battery. This is normal. Allow the battery to charge for a few minutes before turning your phone on.

Turning your phone on or off

- To turn on your phone, press and hold the power button.
- To turn off your phone, press and hold the power button to display an option menu. Then touch Power off > OK.

Dual-card management

Your phone supports dual card dual standby mode of WCDMA+GSM. You can use one card for your personal life and one card for work.

Setting the default SIM card for data services

You can set a default SIM card for data services.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 💿 then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Dual card.
- **3.** Under **Dual card**, touch **Data connection**, and select the SIM card you want to set as the default card.

Locking and unlocking the screen

Locking the screen prevents accidental operation of your phone and protects it from unauthorised use. You can use a number of methods to lock and unlock the screen, and even add lock screen widgets. The pre-installed screen unlock method is used as an example in this section.

Locking the screen

- Method 1: Press the power button to manually lock the screen.
- Method 2: After being idle for a specified period of time, your phone automatically locks its screen.
- To set the screen lock method, touch on the home screen. On the displayed **General** tab, touch **Screen lock**.


Unlocking the screen

If the screen is off, press the power button to turn it on. Slide your finger in any direction to unlock the screen.



Getting to know your home screen

Your home screens are where you'll find your favourite widgets and all your applications. We removed the application list to give you a more convenient and direct path to your applications. The default home screen is shown below.



Status bar: displays notifications and icons. Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.

Display area: displays application icons, folders, and widgets.


Screen position indicator: shows the current screen's position.

Dock: displays your most common applications.


Switching between home screens

Running out of space on the home screen? Not to worry. Your phone lets you create more home screens for various applications and widgets.

• Flick left and right across the screen to switch between the home screens.



• Pinch two fingers together to display the home screen thumbnails. Touch a thumbnail to enter that particular home screen.



Taking a screenshot

Want to show off your new high score in a game or capture something interesting on your phone? Take a screenshot and share away.

Press the power and volume down buttons simultaneously to take a screenshot. Then, open the notification panel and touch

to share the

screenshot. By default, screenshots are saved to the **Pictures** folder in **File Manager**.

You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel, then touch \checkmark > \checkmark to take a screenshot.


Auto-rotate screen

Your phone features a tilt sensor. If you rotate your phone when browsing a web page or viewing a photo, your screen automatically changes between landscape and portrait view. You'll also be able to enjoy tilt sensor-based applications, such as racing games.

To turn the auto-rotate screen function on or off, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel, then touch \checkmark > \circlearrowleft .

Using the notification panel

Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.



- 1 Touch 🔯 to display the settings screen.
- Touch the switch shortcuts on the notification panel to turn the functions on or off.

3	Touch \checkmark to display the switch shortcut list and touch \bigcirc to edit it.
4	Touch Clear to delete all notifications.
5	Touch an application to start it and flick left or right across a notification to dismiss it.

Accessing applications

Starting applications and switching between them

On the home screen, touch an application icon to open it.

To switch to another application, touch to return to the home screen, then touch the icon of the application you want to open.

Viewing recently used applications

Touch and hold \equiv to display the list of recently used applications. You can then:

- Touch an application to start it.
- Touch 着 to clear the list.

Texting

Your phone comes with multiple text input methods. You can quickly enter text using the onscreen keyboard.


- Touch a text box to bring up the onscreen keyboard.
- To hide the onscreen keyboard, touch \frown .

Selecting an input method


- **1.** On the text input screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Touch to select an input method.
- To change your phone's default input method, touch on the home screen. Under All, touch Language & input > Default to select an input method.

Editing text

Discover how to select, cut, copy, and paste text on your phone.



- Select text: Touch and hold the text to bring up . Then drag and and to select more or less text, or touch Select all to select all text in a text box.
- Copy text: Select text and touch Copy.
- Cut text: Select text and touch Cut.
- Paste text: Touch where you want to insert the text, drag to move the insertion point, then touch Paste to paste the text you copied or cut.



Personalising your phone

Changing the home screen style

Your phone supports the standard and simple home screen styles.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Home screen style.
- 3. Choose Simple or Standard, then touch APPLY.

Changing the theme

Changing the theme

- **1.** On the home screen, touch \Box .
- 2. Select a theme and touch APPLY.

Customising a theme

- **1.** On the home screen, touch \Box .
- 2. Under Local, touch CUSTOMIZE.
- 3. From the element list, choose the element you want to modify.

Changing the wallpaper

- On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set Home Screen dialogue box.
- 2. Touch Wallpapers.
- 3. On the Wallpaper screen, you can:
 - Touch **Lock screen wallpaper** to set the wallpaper displayed on the phone lock screen.
 - Touch **Home screen wallpaper** to set the home screen wallpaper.

• Touch **Random change** to have the home screen wallpaper change randomly.

Setting the home screen transition effect

- On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set Home Screen dialogue box.
- 2. Touch Transitions.
- 3. Select a home screen transition effect.

Setting tones

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **②**.
- 2. Under All, touch Sound.
- **3.** Touch **Phone ringtone** or **Notification tone**, then choose either of the following tabs:
 - Ringtone: Choose from the default selection.
 - Music: Choose from the audio files you have saved to your phone.
- 4. Touch APPLY.

Changing the lock screen style

Unlocking the screen with a pattern

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Pattern.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.

After a pattern is set, you will have to draw it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

Unlocking the screen with a PIN

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **.**
- 2. Under All, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > PIN.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock PIN.

After a PIN is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

Unlocking the screen with a password

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Password.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock password. Repeat the password and touch **OK**.

After a password is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

Customising switch shortcuts on the notification panel

You can quickly turn functions on or off, such as Wi-Fi, mobile data, and Bluetooth, by touching their corresponding switch shortcuts on the notification panel. You can also rearrange your switch shortcuts.

- **1.** Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- **2.** Touch \checkmark to display the switch shortcut list.
- **3.** Touch in the upper right corner to access the **Custom shortcuts** screen.
- **4.** Drag a switch shortcut to a new position in the list.

Changing the font size

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **②**.
- 2. Under All, touch Display.
- 3. Touch Font size and select a font size.

Adjusting the screen brightness

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ②.
- 2. Under All, touch Display.
- 3. Touch Brightness.
- **4.** In the displayed dialogue box, perform either of the following operations:
 - Select the Automatic brightness check box to have your phone automatically adjust its screen brightness based on the ambient light.
 - Clear the Automatic brightness check box, then drag the slider left or right to reduce or increase the screen brightness.
- ? You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and adjust the screen brightness using the switch shortcuts.

Calls

Making a call

Smart dialling

Smart dialling lets you quickly find your contacts, just enter part of their name or number to find them.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Enter the initials or first few letters of a contact's name, or part of the contact's phone number. Matching contacts in your phone and phone numbers in your call log are then displayed in a list.
- **3.** From the list, select the contact you want to call.
- **4.** Touch **\(\cupsymbol{\cupsymb**


Making an emergency call

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- **2.** Enter the emergency number, then touch **\(\Circ\)**.

⚠ Emergency calls are subject to mobile network quality, use environment, service provider policies, and local laws and regulations. Never rely solely on your phone for critical communications in an emergency.


Answering or rejecting a call

When a call comes in, you can press the volume button to mute the ringtone.



- Drag 🙃 right to answer the call.
- Drag 🙃 left to reject the call.
- Drag ① up to reject the call and send the caller a message.
- On the dialler screen, touch => Settings > Reject calls with SMS to edit the message that will be sent.

What you can do during a call



0	Touch i > II to place the current call on hold, and touch II again to resume the call.
2	Touch : > to start a three-way call. Before you use three-way calling, make sure you have subscribed to this service. For details, contact your service provider.
3	Touch 🏥 to display the dialler.
4	Touch 1 to use the speakerphone.
5	Touch to end the call.
6	Touch $\slashed{\psi}$ to mute or unmute the microphone.
7	Touch : > to display the notepad.
8	Touch → to view the contact list.

i To return to the call screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel, then touch **Current call**.

Answering a third-party call

Before you answer a third-party call, make sure that you have turned on call waiting.

- **1.** If a call comes in when you are already in another call, drag iright to answer the new call and place the first call on hold.
- 2. To switch between the two calls, touch

 .

Making a conference call

Making conference calls with your friends, family, and co-workers is easy.

i Before you make conference calls, make sure that you have subscribed to this service. For details, contact your service provider.

- 1. Call the first participant.
- **2.** When the call is connected, touch $| > \mathcal{C}_{\Theta}$ to call the second participant. The first participant will be placed on hold.
- **3.** When the second call is connected, touch $\mathbf{1}$ to start a conference call.
- **4.** To add more people to the call, repeat steps 2 and 3.
- **5.** Touch **5.** Touch to end the call.

Using the call log

The call log records your called, answered, and missed calls.

Adding a contact from the call log

- **1.** On the home screen, touch \(\bigcup_{\text{.}}\).
- 2. Under **Dialer**, select the number you want to add as a contact, then touch (*).
- 3. Touch Create new contact or Save to existing contact.
- You can also touch and hold the number you want to add, then touch Create new contact or Save to existing contact.

Contacts

Creating a contact

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Touch Create new contact (or touch \P).
- 3. Choose the save location for the contact.
- **4.** Enter the contact name, phone number, and other details.
- 5. Touch SAVE.

Importing or exporting contacts

Your phone supports contact files in .vcf format. This is the standard format for files storing contacts. Contact names, addresses, phone numbers, and other information can be saved in .vcf files.

Importing contacts from a storage device

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Touch Import contacts > Storage (or touch = > Import/Export > Import from storage).
- 3. Select one or more .vcf files, then touch OK.

Importing contacts from a SIM card

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch Import contacts > SIM 1 or SIM 2 (or touch = > Import/Export > Import from sim 1 or Import from sim 2).
- **3.** Touch the contacts you want to import or touch **All** to select all contacts, then touch **IMPORT**.

Importing contacts from a Bluetooth device

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch Import contacts > Another phone (or touch = > Import/Export > Import from another phone).
- **3.** Select **Supports Bluetooth**, then touch **NEXT**. The phone then turns on Bluetooth and scans for Bluetooth devices.
- **4.** Touch the Bluetooth device from which you want to import contacts.

When the two devices are paired, your phone automatically imports the .vcf file from the other device.

Exporting contacts to a storage device

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch = > Import/Export > Export to storage.
- 3. Touch Export.
- **4.** Choose from where you want to export the contacts and touch **OK**.

To view the .vcf file you just exported, open **File Manager**. By default, the file is saved to the root directory of your phone's internal storage.

Exporting contacts to a SIM card

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- 2. Touch = > Import/Export > Export to sim 1 or Export to sim 2.
- **3.** Touch the contacts you want to export or touch **All** to select all contacts, then touch **EXPORT**.
- **4.** In the displayed dialogue box, touch **OK**.

Copying contacts

You can copy contacts between your phone and SIM card.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- 2. Touch = > Settings > Copy contacts and choose from where you want to copy the contacts.
- **3.** Touch the contacts you want to copy or touch **All** to select all contacts.
- **4.** Touch **COPY** and choose where you want to paste the contacts.

Searching for a contact

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- 2. Enter the contact name or initials. Matching results are displayed as you type.

For example, to search for Joe Bloggs, enter Joe Bloggs or JB.

Sharing contacts

- **1.** On the home screen, touch <a>L
- 2. Touch = > Import/Export > Share contacts.
- **3.** Touch the contacts you want to share, or touch **All** to select all contacts.
- **4.** Touch **SHARE**, and choose a sharing method from the displayed option menu.

Contact groups

You can create a contact group and send a message or email to all group members simultaneously.

Creating a contact group

1. On the home screen, touch ...



- 2. Under Favorites, touch ≡ > Create group.
- **3.** Name the contact group.
- 4. Touch Add members.
- **5.** Select contacts you want to add to the group or touch **All** to select all contacts, then touch **ADD**.
- 6. Touch SAVE.

Sending messages or emails to a contact group

On the home screen, touch . Under **Favorites**, touch and hold the contact group you want to send a message or email to, then choose **Send message** or **Send email** from the displayed option menu.

i You can also open the contact group and touch to send a message or to send an email.

Messaging

Sending a text message

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. In the list of message threads, touch
- **3.** Touch the recipient text box and enter the contact name or phone number. Matching results are displayed as you type. Touch to select a contact.
- Touch + to select more contacts.
- 4. Write your message.
- **5.** Touch 1 or 2.

Sending a multimedia message

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. In the list of message threads, touch -.
- **3.** Touch the recipient text box and enter the contact name or phone number. Matching results are displayed as you type. Touch to select a contact.
- Touch to select more contacts.
- **4.** Touch \equiv > **Add subject** and enter the message subject.
- **5.** Write your message.
- **6.** On the message editing screen, you can:
 - Flick left to switch to voice input.
 - Touch 🔊 , select the attachment type, and attach a file.
- To attach more than one file to the message, touch **Slideshow**. You can touch **Remove slide** to delete the current slideshow.

- **7.** Touch 1 or 2.
- (i) Your phone supports multimedia messages up to 300 KB. Messages larger than that cannot be sent using MMS.

Replying to a message

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- **2.** In the list of message threads, touch a contact name or phone number to view the conversation thread.
- 3. Write your message.
- **4.** Touch 1 or 2.

Searching for a message

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- **2.** In the list of message threads, touch > **Search**.
- **3.** Enter the message or contact name, or parts of them. Your phone then displays matching results.

Managing messages

Copying a message

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. In the list of message threads, touch a contact name or phone number to view the conversation thread.
- 3. Touch and hold the message you want to copy, then touch Copy text.
- **4.** Touch and hold the area where you want to paste the message, then choose **Paste** from the displayed option menu.

Forwarding a message

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- **2.** In the list of message threads, touch a contact name or phone number to view the conversation thread.
- 3. Touch and hold the message you want to forward, then touch Forward.
- **4.** Touch the recipient text box and enter the contact name or phone number.
- Touch to select more contacts.
- **5.** Touch 1 or 2.

Deleting a message

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- **2.** In the list of message threads, touch a contact name or phone number to view the conversation thread.
- **3.** You can then:
 - Touch and hold the message you want to delete, then touch **Delete**.

Deleting a thread

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. In the list of message threads, you can:
 - Touch and hold the thread you want to delete, and touch **Delete**.
 - Touch > **Delete** to delete multiple threads simultaneously.

Browser

Browsing web pages

- **1.** On the home screen, touch <a>O.
- **2.** Enter a website address in the address box. Your phone displays matching websites as you type.
- 3. Touch the website you want to visit.

Managing bookmarks

Bookmarks let you keep track of your favourite websites.

Adding a bookmark

- **1.** On the home screen, touch <a> \bigsic_ .
- **2.** On the **Browser** screen, open the web page you want to add as a bookmark.
- 3. Touch > Save to bookmarks.
- 4. Name the bookmark and touch OK.

Accessing a bookmark

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **(**
- 2. Touch Bookmarks.
- 3. Under Local, touch a bookmark.

Editing a bookmark

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **(**
- 2. Touch Bookmarks.
- 3. Touch and hold the bookmark you want to edit, then touch Edit bookmark.

4. Rename the bookmark, change the website address, or revise the account information. Then touch **OK**.

Setting the home page

- **1.** On the home screen, touch <a> \bigsi .
- 2. Touch > Settings > General > Set homepage.
- **3.** From the displayed option menu, choose the web page you want to set as the home page.

Clearing your browsing history

To better protect your privacy, clear your browsing history from time to time.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch Settings > Privacy & security > Clear history.
- 3. Touch OK.

Fmail

Adding a POP3 or IMAP email account

Certain parameters must be set when you add a POP3 or IMAP email account. For details, contact your email service provider.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Select an email account type.
- 3. Enter your Email address and Password, then touch Next.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to configure the email settings. The system then automatically connects to the server and checks server settings.

When the email account is set up, the **Inbox** screen is displayed.

To add more email accounts, touch = > Settings > NEW ACCOUNT on the **Inbox** screen.

Adding an Exchange account

Exchange is an email system developed by Microsoft to implement communication inside an enterprise. Some email service providers also provide Exchange accounts for individuals and families.

Certain parameters must be set when you add an Exchange account. For details, contact your email service provider.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch Exchange.
- 3. Enter your Email address, Domain, Username, and Password. Then, touch Next.

4. Follow the onscreen instructions to configure the email settings. The system then automatically connects to the server and checks server settings.

When the email account is set up, the **Inbox** screen is displayed.

Sending an email

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- **2.** Touch the email address bar at the top of the screen to select an email account.
- 3. On the **Inbox** screen, touch
- **4.** Enter one or more recipients.
- To send the email to multiple recipients, touch + Cc/Bcc. Separate different email addresses with semicolons (;).
- **5.** Enter the subject, and write your message. Touch **()** to upload any attachments.
- **6.** When you are done, touch to send the email.

Checking your emails

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- **2.** Touch the email address bar at the top of the screen to select an email account.
- **3.** On the **Inbox** screen, touch the email you want to read.
- 4. You can then:
 - Touch 🝵 to delete it.
 - Touch \spadesuit to reply to it.
 - Touch \P to reply to all.
 - Touch

 to forward it.


- Touch ^to go back to the previous email.
- Touch ✓ to skip to the next email.

Multimedia

Camera

Your phone supports a variety of capture scenarios, such as scenery, portrait, and dynamic. It also supports smart, beauty, panoramic, sound & shot, and audio control capture modes.

Capture screen



- 1 Touch to switch to video mode.
- Touch to switch to photo mode.
- Touch the thumbnail to view your photos and videos.
 - Touch an object on the viewfinder to focus the camera.
- Spread two fingers apart to zoom in or pinch them together to zoom out.
- 5 Touch to select a capture mode.
- 6 Touch to set the flash mode.
- 7 Touch to switch between the rear and front cameras.
- 8 Touch for more options.

Taking a photo

- **1.** On the home screen, touch

 .
- **2.** Frame the scene you want to capture. Let your camera focus automatically or touch the screen to focus the camera. When the camera is focused, the frame in the centre of the viewfinder turns green.
- 3. Touch 📵

Shooting a video

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Frame the scene you want to record.
- **3.** Touch to start recording.
- 4. During the recording, touch an object or area to focus on it.
- i Touch to pause recording.
- **5.** Touch **•** to stop recording.

Taking a photo in beauty mode

Want to look flawless in great quality photos? Enable beauty mode for simply stunning photos.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch o > to switch to beauty mode.
- **3.** Drag the slider to adjust the beauty level.
- **4.** Frame the scene you want to capture. The camera will identify a face and focus on it.
- **5.** Touch **.**

Taking an audio photo

You can record an audio clip while taking a photo to make the photo more vivid.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch

 .
- **3.** Frame the scene you want to capture.
- **4.** Touch to take a photo. The phone then records an audio clip for a few seconds. Record your thoughts for the photo you've just taken.

Using HDR

High dynamic range (HDR) imaging technology improves the details in the lightest and darkest areas of photos for true-to-life quality.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch

 .
- 2. Touch $> \frac{1}{100}$ > witch to HDR mode.
- **3.** Frame the scene you want to capture.
- **4.** Touch **.**
- 1 The front camera does not support HDR.



Music

Listening to music

- 2. Select a category.
- **3.** Touch the song you want to play.
- **4.** Touch the playing song to enter the main playback interface.



- flick left or right to switch between the album cover and lyrics.
- Touch to add a song to your Favorites.
- Touch → to switch between different playing modes (repeat the current song, repeat the playlist, shuffle, and play in sequence).
 - Touch ▶ to play and touch ▮ to pause.
- - Touch to skip to the next song.
- **5** Drag the slider to control the playback.
- Touch to display the option menu from which you can perform additional operations.
- 7 Touch to enable or disable DTS audio.
- When a song is playing, touch to exit the playback screen without stopping the song. To return to the music playback screen, open the notification panel and touch the playing song.

Creating a playlist

Creating playlists lets you be creative with your songs and organise them into groups. You'll be able to listen to the playlist that best fits your mood.

Internet connection

Wi-Fi network

Your phone can connect to Wi-Fi networks. Some public locations, such as airports and libraries, may have Wi-Fi networks available for either free or paid use.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- **3.** Touch **Wi-Fi**. Your phone then scans for available Wi-Fi networks and displays them.
- **4.** Touch the Wi-Fi network you want to connect to.
 - If the Wi-Fi network is open, you will directly connect to it.
 - If the Wi-Fi network is encrypted, enter the key when prompted, then touch **Connect**.
- if Wi-Fi and mobile data are both enabled, your phone connects to the Wi-Fi network preferentially.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network using WPS

Wi-Fi protected setup (WPS) lets you quickly connect to a Wi-Fi network. Simply press the WPS button or enter the PIN to connect your phone to a Wi-Fi router that supports WPS.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi.
- **4.** Touch **Push Button** and press the WPS button on the Wi-Fi router.

To connect to a Wi-Fi network through WPS PIN, touch > Enter WPS PIN.

Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

Wi-Fi hotspot

Your phone can function as a Wi-Fi hotspot for other devices, sharing its mobile data connection.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch **Tethering & portable hotspot**.
- 4. Select the Portable Wi-Fi hotspot check box to turn on Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 5. Touch Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- **6.** Set the Wi-Fi hotspot's name, encryption mode, and key. When other devices want to access your phone's network, this key must be entered.
- it is recommended that you set the encryption mode to WPA2PSK to better secure the Wi-Fi network.

7. Touch Save.

On the device you want to use, search for and connect to your phone's Wi-Fi network.

Controlling your data usage

Your phone's data usage control function lets you check and control your data usage. Set a data usage cycle and a mobile data limit for this period and you will be notified when data usage reaches this limit.

Setting your mobile data usage limits

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- 4. Select the **Set mobile data limit** check box.
- **5.** Set the data usage limits as follows:
 - Drag the limit line up or down to adjust the mobile data usage limit.
 - Drag the warning line up or down to adjust the mobile data usage warning value. When your data usage reaches the warning line, you will be notified.
 - Drag the date lines left or right to check the data usage during a specific period of time.
 - Touch **Data usage cycle** to set the statistical cycle for data usage.

Viewing the data usage of an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- **4.** Flick down to view the data usage of all applications.
- **5.** Touch an application for more details.

Restricting the background mobile data usage

You can restrict the background mobile data usage of some or all applications to save data traffic. This function takes effect only when your phone is using a mobile data connection. When your phone is connected to a Wi-Fi network, applications run without any data restrictions.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- **4.** Touch , and select the **Restrict mobile bkgd. data** check box to restrict the background mobile data usage of all applications.
- To restrict the background mobile data usage of a specific application, choose the application from the application list on the Data usage screen to display its data usage details. Then touch and select the Restrict mobile bkgd. data check box.

Restricting automatic data synchronisation

Restricting automatic data synchronisation helps save data traffic and battery power. After this function is enabled, you have to manually synchronise your accounts.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- **4.** Touch and clear the **Auto-sync data** check box.

Sharing data

Bluetooth

Your phone is Bluetooth-capable, allowing you to connect to other Bluetooth-enabled devices for wireless data transmission. When using Bluetooth, stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of other Bluetooth devices.

Turning Bluetooth on or off

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth on or off. After Bluetooth is turned on, is displayed on the status bar.
- 7 Turn off Bluetooth when it is not in use to save battery power.

Renaming your phone

Before you rename your phone, turn on Bluetooth. By default, your phone's name is its model number. You can change the name to one that's more personal and easier to find.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Q** .
- 2. Under All. touch Bluetooth.
- 3. Touch = > Rename phone.
- 4. Rename your phone and touch Rename.

Searching for and pairing with other Bluetooth devices

Before pairing your phone with another device, turn on Bluetooth. Your phone's name will be displayed. Select the check box next to the phone name to set your phone as discoverable to other Bluetooth devices.

1. On the home screen, touch .

- **2.** Under **All**, touch **Bluetooth**. Your phone will then scan for other Bluetooth devices in range.
- **3.** In the list of detected Bluetooth devices, touch a device and follow the onscreen instructions to pair with it.

To disconnect from a paired Bluetooth device, under **PAIRED DEVICES**, touch Support Su

if you cannot set up a Bluetooth connection to another device, the device may not be compatible with your phone.

Sharing a file using Bluetooth

To exchange data with another Bluetooth device, enable Bluetooth on both devices and pair them with each other.

- **2.** Touch and hold the file you want to send, then touch **Share** > **Bluetooth**.
- **3.** Select a device.

Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows two devices to connect to each other for data transmission without using an access point.

Connecting two devices using Wi-Fi Direct

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Wi-Fi to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. In the Wi-Fi network list, touch ≡ > Wi-Fi direct to scan for available devices.
- 4. Select a device.

Sending a file using Wi-Fi Direct

- 2. Touch and hold the file you want to send, then touch Share.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi Direct to scan for available devices.
- **4.** Select a device.

Receiving a file using Wi-Fi Direct

When a file comes in through Wi-Fi Direct, your phone automatically starts to receive it. You can open the notification panel to view the progress of the file transfer.

By default, received files are saved to the Wi-Fi Direct folder in File Manager.

Connecting your phone to a computer

MTP mode

MTP mode lets you transfer media files, such as photos, songs, and videos, between your phone and a computer. Windows Media Player 11 or later is required.

- **1.** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2.** On the **USB connection methods** screen, choose **Device file manager (MTP)**. The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- **3.** After the driver is installed, open the new drive and begin transferring media files between your phone and computer. Multimedia content on your phone can only be viewed through Windows Media Player.

HiSuite mode

HiSuite is Huawei's file transfer application. It lets you back up, synchronise, and transfer data between your phone and computer.

- **1.** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the USB connection methods screen, choose PC Suite (HiSuite). .

3. On the computer, open the new drive, double-click

HiSuiteDownLoader.exe, and follow the onscreen instructions to install HiSuite. You can then manage your phone's data on the displayed HiSuite window

Mass storage mode

If a microSD card is inserted into your phone, you can use your phone as a USB mass storage device and transfer files between your phone and a computer.

- **1.** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the USB connection methods screen, choose USB flash drive.
- **3.** After the driver is installed, the computer will identify your phone as a USB mass storage device. Open the new drive to view files on your microSD card.

File Manager

Switching between category and list views

File Manager provides category and list views.

- Under the category view, audio clips, videos, images, and applications in your phone's internal storage and microSD card are displayed by category, easy for you to browse through.
- Under the list view, files in your phone's internal storage and microSD card are displayed in a list.

On the home screen, touch . Under **Local**, touch to the category view or touch to switch to the list view.

Creating a folder

- 2. Under Local, switch to the list view, then touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch \equiv > New folder.
- **4.** Name the folder, then touch **Save**.

Searching for a file

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- 2. Under Local, switch to the list view, then touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch \equiv > Search.
- **4.** Enter part or all of the file name. Search results are displayed as you type.

Copying, cutting, and pasting a file

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- **2.** Under **Local**, switch to the list view, then touch **Internal** or **SD card**.
- 3. Touch 🖹 or 🧏 .
- **4.** Touch the file you want to copy or cut, then touch **COPY** or **CUT**.
- **5.** Select where you want to paste the file, then touch **PASTE**.

Renaming a file

- 2. Under Local, switch to the list view, then touch Internal or SD card.
- **3.** Touch and hold the file you want to rename, then touch **Rename**.
- 4. Rename the file and touch OK.

Deleting a file

- 2. Under Local, switch to the list view, then touch Internal or SD card.
- **3.** Touch 📋 .
- **4.** Select the file you want to delete, then touch **DELETE**.
- 5. Touch OK.

Creating a shortcut for a file or folder

- 2. Under Local, switch to the list view, then touch Internal or SD card.
- **3.** Touch and hold the file or folder you want to create a shortcut for, then choose **Desktop shortcuts** from the displayed option menu.

Checking the storage status

Before you save large files to your phone's internal storage or microSD card, make sure there is enough space.

- 2. Under Local, touch = > Storage.
- **3.** On the **Storage** screen, view the total and available space in your phone's internal storage or microSD card.

Managing applications

Downloading applications

A rich selection of applications are available from a variety of sources. You can:

- Download applications from Google's Play Store.
- Download applications from web pages using the browser on your phone.
- Download applications using a computer, and copy the applications to the phone.
- Connect the phone to a computer, and download applications using HiSuite or other third-party applications.

Installing an application

- App Centre should be your primary download source. Some applications downloaded from some other sources may be malicious or incompatible with your phone.
- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** $> \bigcirc$.
- **2.** Select the application you want to install.
- 3. Touch = > Install then Done.
- During the installation, an Install blocked message may be displayed.
 Read the message carefully. If you want to continue with the installation, touch Settings, then select the Unknown sources check box to allow installation of third-party applications. Then touch ← to proceed.

Viewing applications

You can view the sizes and access permissions of applications installed on your phone. You can also view the running applications to check the system running status.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Select an application type: downloaded, running, or all.
- 4. Touch an application to view its details, and flick up or down for more information.

Sharing an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch and hold the application you want to share until < is displayed at the top of the screen.
- 2. Drag the application to < .
- 3. On the displayed screen, select a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions to share the application.
- System applications cannot be shared.

Uninstalling an application

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Manage apps.
- **3.** Flick to **All**, and select the application you want to uninstall.
- 4. Touch Uninstall > OK.
- Some pre-installed applications cannot be uninstalled.

Clearing the application cache

You can clear the application cache to free up the phone storage.

- 2. Under All, touch Manage apps.
- **3.** Flick to **All**, then touch **Clear cache**.

Phone Manager

Phone accelerator

If your phone is slow to respond, there may be too many open applications using too much memory. Use phone accelerator to optimise your system.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Touch Phone accelerator.
- **3.** Select the unwanted applications, then touch **CLOSE**.

Storage cleaner

- 2. Touch Storage cleaner.
- **3.** Touch **Smart scan**, and clean your phone storage based on the scan results.
- On the **Storage cleaner** screen, touch to have your phone periodically (you set the time interval) clean the cache, thumbnails, storage, and more.

Harassment filter

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Touch Harassment filter.
- 3. On the Harassment filter screen, you can:
 - Touch **Calls** or **Messages** to view the blocked calls or messages.
 - Touch **Blacklist** > **ADD CONTACTS** to add a number to the blacklist.

Power saving

- 2. Touch Power saving.
- 3. On the Power saving screen, you can:
 - Turn off the functions not in use to save power.
 - Touch **Power monitoring** and manually optimise the power plan based on the scan results.
 - Touch **Smart** to enable smart mode and have your phone conserve power while still allowing full use of all phone functions.
 - Touch **Endurance** to enable endurance mode and have your phone consume the least amount of power possible.
 - Touch **Normal** to enable normal mode.

Notification manager

Some applications may push many types of notifications to your phone. Notification manager lets you set restriction rules on notifications to avoid receiving unnecessary information.

- 2. Flick left on the lower part of the screen, then touch Notification manager.
- **3.** On the **Notification manager** screen, you can:
 - Touch **Rules** to view applications that may send notifications to the notification panel and set push rights for your applications.
 - Touch Log to view the blocked notifications.

Startup manager

- **1.** On the home screen, touch \bigcirc .
- 2. Flick left on the lower part of the screen, then touch **Startup manager**.
- 3. On the Startup manager screen, you can:
 - Select an application to have it run automatically at system startup.
 - Deselect an application to prevent it from running at system startup.

Tools

Clock

Clock lets you view the local time from around the world, keep track of time with the stopwatch or timer, and set an alarm for your morning wake-up call.

Alarm

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- 2. Under Alarm, you can:
 - Add an alarm: Touch +, and set the alarm time, ringtone, how often it repeats, and more. Then touch **DONE**.
 - Turn an alarm on or off: Touch the switch button to the right of an alarm to turn it on or off.
 - Configure alarm settings: Touch , and set whether the alarm rings in silent mode, the snooze duration, and what the volume buttons do when pressed.
 - Delete an alarm: Touch 🝵 , select the alarm you want to delete, then touch **DELETE**.

When an alarm rings, touch **5 Min Nap** to snooze or flick **Close** right to stop the alarm.

Using the world clock

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Under World clock, you can:
 - Add a city: Touch +, enter a city name or choose a city from the city list, then touch the city you want to add.
 - Set the home city: Touch **②** to set your home time zone and system date and time.

• Delete a city: Touch 🝵 , select the city you want to delete, then touch

Timer

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- 2. On the Timer tab, rotate the dial to set the timer duration, or touch 1 min,3 min, or 5 min to quickly set a time duration.
- **3.** When you are done, touch **Start** to start the timer.
- **4.** When the timer ends, the phone plays a tone and starts overtime timing. Touch **Close** to stop the tone and reset the timer.
- When the timer is running, touch **Reset** to reset it.

Weather

Weather provides you with the latest weather information for any city around the world. You can share weather information with your family and friends.

Before you use **Weather**, turn on your phone's GPS and data service.

Adding a city

Add cities of interest to check their real-time weather information.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** >
- 2. Touch $\equiv > +$.
- 3. Enter a city name. Matching cities are then displayed.
- **4.** Select the city you want to add.
- In addition to your current city, you can add up to nine cities.

Updating the weather

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > \bigcirc .
- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you want to update.

- **3.** Touch \mathcal{C} to update the weather.
- You can also set Weather to automatic update mode. Touch := > > Settings, select Auto update, and set Update interval. Your phone will then update the weather at the interval you set.

Sharing weather information

Your phone lets you send weather information as a text message to remind your family and friends of weather changes.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > .
- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you want to share.
- **3.** Touch \leq to display the messaging screen.
- 4. You can then:
 - Enter a phone number.
 - Touch \bigoplus to select a contact.
- **5.** Touch 1 or 2 to send the weather information.

Calculator

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > \bigsize 1.
- **2.** Rotate your phone to portrait or landscape view to switch between the basic and scientific calculators.
- Make sure the screen auto-rotate function is turned on.


FM radio

Connect a headset to the phone. **FM Radio** uses the headset as an antenna.

Searching for stations

- **2.** Touch \equiv > \mathbf{Q} to search for and save available stations.
- ? Your phone will automatically search for and save stations the first time you open the FM radio.

Phone settings

Turning aeroplane mode on or off

Your phone's signal may interfere with an aeroplane's flight systems. When you are aboard an aeroplane, turn off your phone or switch it to aeroplane mode. Aeroplane mode lets you safely use your phone to listen to music or play games, but disables your phone's wireless features.

Use either of the following methods to turn **Airplane mode** on or off:

- Press and hold the power button, and touch **Airplane mode**.
- On the home screen, touch ② . Under All, touch Airplane mode.

When aeroplane mode is on, \times appears in the status bar.

Tone settings

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Sound.
- **3.** On the **Sound** screen, you can:
 - Touch Volumes and drag the sliders to set the volume of music, ringtones, notification tones, alarms, calls, and more.
 - Touch **Silent mode** to turn silent mode on or off.
 - Select or clear the Vibrate in silent mode check box to set whether your phone vibrates when it is in silent mode.
 - Select or clear the Vibrate when ringing check box to set whether your phone vibrates when you have an incoming call.
 - Touch **Phone ringtone** to select a ringtone.
 - Touch **Notification tone** to set a notification tone.

• Touch or clear the check box under **SYSTEM** to turn the notification tone or vibration on or off when you touch or lock the screen, take a screenshot, dial a number, and more.

Display settings

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Display.
- 3. On the **Display** screen, you can:
 - Touch **Brightness** to adjust the screen brightness. To manually adjust the brightness, clear the **Automatic brightness** check box.
 - Touch Wallpaper to set the lock screen and home screen wallpapers.
 - Select or clear the **Auto-rotate screen** check box to turn the screen autorotate function on or off. If this function is turned on, your screen's orientation will automatically change with the way you hold your phone when you perform certain operations, such as browsing a web page, viewing a picture, or writing a message.
 - Touch **Sleep** to set a screen timeout period. If idle for the specified period, your phone automatically locks its screen to save battery power.
 - Touch **Screen Candy** to set a screen timeout period. If idle for the specified period, your phone automatically locks its screen to save battery power.
 - Touch **Font size** to change the display font size.

Turning do not disturb mode on or off

To avoid being disturbed when you need to focus on important business, turn on do not disturb mode. In do not disturb mode, your phone will ring only when you receive calls from allowed contacts. Other calls will be rejected, and message and other notification tones will be muted.

1. On the home screen, touch .



- 2. Under All, touch Do not disturb.
- 3. On the **Do not disturb** screen, you can:
 - Touch Enable to turn do not disturb mode on or off. In do not disturb mode, is displayed on the status bar.
 - Touch **Scheduled** to schedule the effective time period for do not disturb mode.
 - Touch **Allowed contacts** to add contacts whose calls you can still receive in do not disturb mode.
 - Touch **Repeat calls** to turn the repeat calls function on or off. After the repeat calls function is turned on, the second call from the same number made within 3 minutes will not be muted.

Setting the date and time

- 2. Under All, touch Date & time.
- 3. On the **Date & time** screen, you can:
 - Select the **Automatic date & time** and **Automatic time zone** check boxes to use the network date and time.
 - Clear the **Automatic date & time** and **Automatic time zone** check boxes to manually set the date, time, and time zone.
 - Select or clear the **Use 24-hour format** check box to switch between the 12-hour and 24-hour formats
 - Touch Choose date format to select how you want the date to be displayed.

Changing the system language

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Language & input.

- 3. Touch Language.
- 4. Select a language.

Setting the PIN of your SIM card

A personal identification number (PIN) is delivered with your SIM card to better protect your phone data. If you enable the SIM card lock, you must enter the PIN each time you turn your phone on.

Before you perform the following operations, make sure you have obtained your SIM card's PIN from your service provider.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Set Card 1/Card 2 lock and choose Card 1 or Card 2.
- 4. Select the Lock SIM card check box.
- **5.** Enter your PIN, then touch **OK**.
- **6.** Touch **Change SIM PIN** to change the PIN.

⚠ The SIM card allows only a limited number of consecutive retries if an incorrect PIN is entered. If this limit is exceeded, you must enter a PIN unblocking key (PUK), which you can obtain from your service provider. The number of consecutive attempts to enter the PUK incorrectly is also limited. If this limit is exceeded, your SIM card will be permanently disabled. For details about these limits, contact your service provider.

Accessibility

You can turn accessibility features on or off, such as magnification gestures and large text.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Accessibility.

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
