Exciting features

Wide aperture mode

In wide aperture mode, you can manually increase the aperture for a shallow depth of field and blurry background or decrease it to bring the foreground and background into focus.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **©** Camera.
- 2. Slide your finger across the screen to switch to wide aperture mode.
- **3.** Touch an area on the screen to adjust the focal point.
- **4.** Drag up to increase the aperture or down to decrease the aperture.
- **5.** Touch to take a photo.
- indicates photos taken in wide aperture mode. You can touch
 - to edit the photo, including adjusting the focal point, blurring the background and applying a filter.

Safe

The Safe function helps you protect your important files and privacy.

Enabling the Safe

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **3** Files.
- 2. Under Categories or Local, touch Ω .
- 3. Touch Enable.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen prompts to enter passwords and answers to security questions, then touch **Done**.

Adding files to the Safe

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Files**.
- 2. Under Categories or Local, touch Ω .
- **3.** Enter the password and touch **Done**.
- 4. Touch Add.
- **5.** Follow the onscreen prompts and select the files that you want to add to the Safe.
- **6.** Touch **ADD** to add the selected files to the Safe.

Launching the camera from gallery

- **1.** On the home screen, touch Gallery.
- **2.** Swipe down from the **Time** screen to display the viewfinder in half screen mode and swipe down again to open the camera.
- Not all camera features are available in half screen mode.
- **3.** Touch to take a photo.
- **4.** Touch \triangleleft **Return** to return to Gallery.

QR code

You can scan QR codes using the camera and gallery.

Scanning a QR code using Gallery

- **1.** On the home screen, touch Gallery.
- **2.** Choose a QR code photo.
- **3.** Touch the photo. Gallery will automatically scan the QR code entry.
- 4. Touch the QR code entry to view further details.

Scanning a QR code using Camera

- 1. On the home screen, touch Camera.
- **2.** Frame the QR code with the camera. The camera will automatically scan the QR code entry.
- 3. Touch the QR code entry to view details.

Privacy protection

If you have private data in your phone that you wish to keep hidden from others, you can enable privacy protection and set two different passwords, one for yourself and one for quests.

Enabling privacy protection

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Privacy protection > Let's start.
- **4.** Select a password format.
- **5.** Follow the onscreen prompts to enter the owner password and guest password.

After privacy mode has been enabled, entering your owner password allows access to all the content on your phone. Entering the guest password allows access to content that has not been protected.

Setting private information


- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Privacy protection.
- 4. Enter the owner password and then touch Next.
- **5.** Under **Set private data**, set your private contacts, albums and applications.

Disabling privacy protection

- 1. On the home screen, touch Settings.
- 2. Under All, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Privacy protection.
- **4.** Enter the owner password and touch **Next**.
- **5.** Touch the **Privacy protection** switch to disable privacy protection.
- After privacy protection has been disabled, your owner password will function as the screen unlock password and the guest password will become invalid.



Inserting the micro-SIM card and nano-SIM card

↑ Your phone supports only standard micro-SIM cards and nano-SIM cards. Do not use any other sizes as they may damage your phone. To replace or purchase a SIM card, contact your service provider.

Make sure your phone is turned off before you insert the micro-SIM card and nano-SIM card.


1. Insert an eject tool or paper clip into the hole on the SIM card trays to eject them.



- Exercise caution when using the SIM eject tool to avoid injury or damaging your phone. Keep it away from children.
- 2. Gently pull out the SIM card trays.




3. Place the micro-SIM and nano-SIM cards into their respective card trays. Make sure the gold contact areas and bevelled edges of the cards are facing the right directions (a). Then push the card trays back into place (b).



Removing the micro-SIM card and nano-SIM card

Make sure your phone is turned off before you remove the micro-SIM card and nano-SIM card.

- 1. Insert an eject tool or paper clip into the hole on the SIM card tray to eject it (a).
- 2. Take out the SIM card, and push the SIM card tray back into place (b).




Inserting a microSD card




⚠ Do not insert the nano-SIM card and microSD card into the upper card tray together.

You can expand your phone's storage capacity with a microSD card.


1. Insert an eject tool or paper clip into the hole on the microSD card tray to eject it.



2. Gently take out the microSD card tray.



3. Place the microSD card into the card tray. Make sure the gold contact area and bevelled edge of the microSD card are facing the right directions (a). Then push the card tray back into place (b).



Removing the microSD card

- ⚠ Unmount the microSD card before you remove it; otherwise, the microSD card may be damaged.
- **1.** On the home screen, touch ②.
- 2. Under All, touch Storage.
- 3. Touch My SD card > Unmount SD card.
- **4.** Insert an eject tool or paper clip into the hole on the microSD card tray to eject it.
- **5.** Carefully take out the microSD card.

Locking and unlocking the screen

Locking the screen

- Method 1: Press the power button to manually lock the screen.
- Method 2: After being idle for a specified period of time, the screen will lock automatically.
- To set the screen lock method, touch Settings on the home screen.

 On the General tab, touch Screen lock > Screen lock.

Unlocking the screen

When the screen is off, press the power button to turn it on. Slide your finger in any direction to unlock the screen.



Dual SIM settings

Enabling or disabling a SIM card

You can insert two SIM cards into your phone and use one or both of them at the same time. When you do not need to use a SIM card, disable it.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All, touch SIM card management.
- Select or deselect the check box next to Card 1 or Card 2 to enable or disable a SIM card.
- The settings displayed may vary according to your network operator and phone model.

Setting the default SIM card for data services

You can set a default SIM card for data services.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Settings**
- 2. Under All, touch SIM card management.
- 3. Touch Card 1 or Card 2 next to Default data network.
- i The settings displayed may vary according to your network operator and phone model.

Setting the default SIM card for calling and messaging

You can set the default SIM card for calling or messaging.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All, touch SIM card management.
- 3. Touch Card 1 or Card 2 next to Default calls/messages.
- 7 This function may not be supported by some network operators.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- **1.** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Under **Shortcuts**, touch and hold $\widehat{\$}$ to display the Wi-Fi settings screen.
- **3.** Touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi. Your phone then scans for available Wi-Fi networks and displays them.
- **4.** Touch the Wi-Fi network you want to connect to. If the Wi-Fi network is encrypted, enter the password when prompted.

Turning on mobile data

- **1.** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Under **Shortcuts**, touch to turn on mobile data.
- When you don't need to access the Internet, turn off mobile data to save battery power and reduce mobile data usage.

Connecting your phone to a computer

Use a USB cable to connect your phone to a computer and follow the onscreen prompts to select a connection mode to transfer photos, videos, songs and other files between your phone and computer.

Importing contacts from your old phone

You can import contacts from your old phone in any of the following ways:

SIM card	Copy your contacts on your SIM card to your new phone. For details, see Importing contacts from a SIM card.
Storage device	If your old phone has a microSD card inserted, export contacts in your old phone as a .vcf file to the microSD card and then import the contacts to your new phone. For details, see Importing contacts from a storage device.
Bluetooth	Turn on Bluetooth on both your old and new phones and import your contacts using Bluetooth. For details, see Importing contacts from a Bluetooth device.
Backup	If your old phone supports Backup, back up your contacts and restore them to your new phone. For details, see Backup.
Computer	Synchronise your contacts from your old phone to a computer and use HiSuite to synchronise them to your new phone. For details, see HiSuite mode.

Touchscreen gestures



Touch: Tap an item once. For example, touch an application to select or open it.




Touch and hold: Touch and leave your finger on the screen for 2 seconds or more. For example, touch and hold a blank area on the home screen to enter editing mode.



Swipe: Move your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example, you can swipe left or right under

Notifications on the notification panel to dismiss a notification. Swipe vertically or horizontally to go to other home screens, scroll through a document and more.



Drag: Touch and hold an item and then move it to another position. You can rearrange applications and widgets on the home screen this way.



Spread apart and pinch together: Spread two fingers apart to zoom in and pinch them together to zoom out on a map, web page or picture.



Pinch three fingers together: On the home screen, pinch three fingers together to display screen thumbnails.

Motion control

Motion control lets you control your phone using simple gestures. For example, mute the phone by turning over your phone or answer and make calls quickly.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All. touch Motion control.
- **3.** On the **Motion control** screen, select an option and select a motion to enable it.
 - Flip: Mute sounds and stop vibration from incoming calls, alarms and timers.



• **Pick up**: Pick up the phone to reduce the ring volume of incoming calls, alarms and timers.



• Raise to ear: When a call comes in, raise your phone to your ear to answer it. Similarly, from the call or contact details screen, raise your phone to your ear to call the corresponding number.



• **Shake**: Touch and hold a blank area on the home screen to enter editing mode. Shake your phone to arrange your icons.



• **Tilt**: In home screen editing mode, if you touch and hold an icon or widget and tilt your phone to the left or right, you'll be able to move it to the next screen.



• **Double touch**: Touch the screen twice to turn it on.



• **Draw**: When your phone's screen is turned off, draw a letter to open the corresponding application.

Home

Your home screens are where you can find your favourite widgets and all your applications. We did away with the application list to give you a more convenient and direct path to your applications.



Status bar: displays notifications and icons. Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.

Display area: displays application icons, folders and widgets.

Screen position indicator: shows the current screen's position.

Dock: displays frequently used applications.

Navigation bar: displays virtual keys.

Switching between home screens

Running out of space on the home screen? Not to worry. Your phone lets you create additional home screens.



Auto-rotate screen

If you rotate your phone when browsing a web page or viewing a photo, your screen automatically changes between landscape and portrait views.

Additionally, this feature allows you to enjoy tilt sensor-based applications, such as racing games.

- **1.** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- **2.** Under **Shortcuts**, touch **Auto-rotate** to enable or disable the auto-rotate screen function.

Taking a screenshot

Want to share an interesting scene in a film or show off your new high score in a game? Take a screenshot and share away.

Press the power and volume down buttons simultaneously to take a screenshot. Then open the notification panel and touch \mathcal{L} to share the screenshot. By default, screenshots are saved to the **Screenshots** folder in **Gallery**.

Organising applications and widgets on the home screen

The following operations allow you to organise your application, widget or folder:

- Adding a widget: On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Widgets option menu. Select a widget and drag it to the home screen.
- if the home screen doesn't have enough space, your phone will automatically create a new home screen to the right of the original and place the widget on the new home screen. You can have a maximum of nine home screens.
- Moving an application or widget: On the home screen, touch and hold
 an application icon or widget until your phone vibrates to enter editing
 mode. You can then drag an application or widget to any blank available
 space.
- Deleting an application or widget: On the home screen, touch and hold the application icon or widget you want to delete until is displayed.

 Drag the unwanted application icon or widget to i.
- Creating a folder: On the home screen, drag one application on top of another application to create a folder containing both applications.

Managing home screens

On the home screen, pinch three fingers together to display the home screen thumbnails.

- **Setting default home screen**: Touch at the bottom of the screen and select the current home screen as the default home screen.
- Moving a home screen: Touch and hold the home screen until your phone vibrates and drag the home screens to adjust their positions.
- Adding a home screen: Touch + to add a home screen.

Notification

Status indicator

The status indicator on your phone indicates the following information depending on the phone's status:

- Blinking red: The battery level is low.
- Steady red (when charging): The battery level is low.
- Steady yellow (when charging): The battery level is medium.
- Steady green (when charging): The battery is almost or already full.
- Blinking green: There are unread messages or notifications.

Notification panel

Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel. Swipe left or right to switch between the notifications and shortcuts tabs.



- Touch to view the notification details and swipe left or right across a notification to dismiss it.
- Touch iii to delete all notifications.
- Touch \checkmark to expand or collapse the shortcut switches. (This feature may not be available on all phones.)

To switch to another application, touch Home to return to the home screen and then touch the icon of the application you want to open.

- Swipe left or right to display recently used applications.
- Swipe up on an application thumbnail to close it.
- Swipe up from the bottom of the screen until (iii) is displayed to close all the applications in the list.

Changing the home screen style

Your phone supports the standard and simple home screen styles.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All, touch Home screen style.
- **3.** Choose **Simple** and touch .
- Touch **Standard** to switch from the simple home screen to the standard home screen.

Changing the theme

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **5** Themes.
- **2.** Select a theme and touch .

Changing the wallpaper

- **1.** Touch and hold a blank area on the home screen to enter editing mode.
- 2. Touch Wallpapers.
- **3.** On the **Wallpapers** screen, you can:
 - Touch **Lock screen wallpaper** to set the wallpaper displayed on the phone lock screen.
 - Touch **Home screen wallpaper** to set the home screen wallpaper.
 - Touch **Shake to change** to change the home screen wallpaper by shaking your phone.
 - Touch the **Random change** switch to get the home screen wallpaper to change automatically at periodic intervals.

Setting the ringtone

- 1. On the home screen, touch Settings.
- 2. Under All, touch Sound.
- **3.** Touch **Card 1 phone ringtone**, **Card 2 phone ringtone** or **Default notification tone** and choose either of the following tabs:
 - Ringtone: Choose from the default selection.
 - Music: Choose from the audio files you have saved to your phone.
- **4.** Touch ✓ .

Changing the font size

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All, touch Display.
- 3. Touch Font size and select a font size.

Texting


Your phone comes with multiple text input methods. You can quickly enter text using the onscreen keyboard.

- Touch a text box to bring up the onscreen keyboard.
- To hid0e the onscreen keyboard, touch \vee .

Selecting an input method

- **1.** On the text input screen, swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Under Notifications, touch Choose input method.
- 3. Select an input method.
- To change your phone's default input method, touch **Settings** on the home screen. Under **All**, touch **Language & input** > **Default keyboard** to select an input method.



Editing text

You can select, cut, copy and paste text on your phone.



- Select text: Touch and hold the text to bring up . Then drag or
 to select more or less text or touch Select all to select all text in the text box.
- Copy text: Select text and touch Copy.
- Cut text: Select text and touch Cut.
- Paste text: Touch and hold where you want to insert the text and touch Paste.



Calls and contacts

Making a call

Smart dialling

Smart dialling lets you quickly find contacts by entering parts of their names or numbers

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Dialer**.
- 2. Under **Dialer**, enter the initials or first few letters of a contact's name or part of the contact's phone number. Matching contacts in your phone and phone numbers in your call log are then displayed in a list.
- **3.** From the list, select the contact you want to call. Touch \(\mathbb{C}\) or \(\mathbb{C}\) to make a call.

Making a call from Contacts

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Q** Dialer.
- 2. Under Contacts, touch the contact you want to call.


Making a call from the call log

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Q** Dialer.
- 2. Under **Dialer**, touch the contact or number you want to call from the call log. Touch or to make a call.

Making an emergency call

In the event of an emergency, you will still be able to make emergency calls without using a SIM card. However, you must be in an area with network coverage.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Dialer**.
- 2. Under **Dialer**, enter your local emergency number and then touch 📞 .



Speed-dialing

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Dialer**.
- 2. Under Dialer, touch \equiv > Speed dial settings.
- **3.** Touch \bigoplus to choose a contact from the list and assign a number key to the contact.
- The number key 1 is the default key for voicemail. You can't set it as a speed-dial number.
- **4.** On the dialler, touch and hold the number key assigned to a contact and then touch or to quickly call the contact.

Making an international call

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Q** Dialer.
- 2. On the dialler, touch and hold 0 to enter +.
- **3.** Enter the country or region code, area code and phone number in sequence.
- 4. Touch Cor C.

Answering or rejecting a call

When a call comes in, you can press the volume button to mute the ringtone.



- Drag Oright to answer the call.
- Drag left to reject the call.
- Drag Oup to reject the call and send the caller a message.
- \bigcirc On the dialler screen, touch \equiv > Call settings > Reject calls with SMS to edit the message that will be sent.

What you can do during a call



- Touch \wedge > || to place the current call on hold, then touch || again to resume the call.
- 2 Touch Φ to mute or unmute the microphone.
- Touch + to start a three-way call. Make sure you have subscribed to this service before using three-way calling. For details, contact your network operator.
- 4 Touch □ to use the speaker.
- 5 Touch to display the dialler.
- 6 Touch to end the call.
- 7 Touch $\stackrel{\triangle}{\sim}$ to display your contacts.
- 8 Touch \wedge > \Box to write a note.
- To return to the call screen, swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel and then touch **Current call**.

Answering a third-party call

Before you answer a third-party call, make sure that you have turned on call waiting.



- Before using Wi-Fi Direct to connect two devices, ensure that you have turned on Wi-Fi on both devices.
- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2. Under All, touch Wi-Fi.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi to enable Wi-Fi.
- 4. Touch Wi-Fi direct to scan for available devices.
- **5.** Choose a device.

Sending a file using Wi-Fi Direct

Touch and hold the file you want to send and then touch **Share** > **Wi-Fi Direct** on the displayed window. Your phone will automatically search for and display available devices. Select a device to receive your file.

Receiving a file using Wi-Fi Direct

When a file comes in through Wi-Fi Direct, your phone automatically starts to receive it. Open your notification panel and touch **Notifications** to check the file transfer progress.

By default, received files are saved to the Wi-Fi Direct folder in Files.

Transferring data between your phone and computer

MTP mode

MTP mode lets you transfer media files such as photos, songs and videos between your phone and a computer. Windows Media Player 11 or later is required.

- **1.** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2.** On the **USB connection methods** screen, touch **Media device (MTP)**. The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.

After the driver has been installed, open the newly recognised drive and start transferring media files between your phone and computer. Multimedia content on your phone can be viewed through Windows Media Player.

HiSuite mode

HiSuite is a file transfer application developed by Huawei that lets you back up, synchronise and transfer data between your phone and computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2.** On the **USB connection methods** screen, touch **PC Suite (HiSuite)**. The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- On the computer, open the newly recognised drive, double-click
 HiSuiteDownLoader.exe and follow the onscreen prompts to install
 HiSuite.

You can then manage your phone's data on the HiSuite window.

USB flash drive mode

If a microSD card is inserted into your phone, you can use your phone as a USB storage device and transfer files between your phone and a computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2.** On the **USB connection methods** screen, touch **USB flash drive**. The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.

The computer recognises your phone as a USB storage device. Open the newly recognised drive to view files on your microSD card

Transferring data between your phone and a USB storage device

You can directly connect your phone to a USB storage device using a USB OTG cable to transfer data. Compatible USB storage devices include USB flash drives, card readers and phones that have a microSD card inserted.

To purchase a USB OTG cable, please contact an authorised Huawei retailer or your device vendor.



To connect to another phone, ensure that the phone has a microSD card inserted. You can then:

- 1. Connect two phones using a USB OTG cable and a USB cable.
- Set USB connection methods on the phone to be connected to USB flash drive.
- **3.** Touch **O Settings** on your phone's home screen.
- 4. Under All, touch Storage.

- 5. Touch My USB storage > Mount USB storage.

Touch **Settings** > **Storage** > **My USB storage** > **Unmount USB storage** on your phone and disconnect the USB OTG cable from the USB cable.

Multi-screen display

You can push photos, videos or games from your phone to a large screen (such as a TV) to view them more conveniently and share them with your family and friends.

If your TV supports HDMI, you can use it with an Android TV Box or a similar wireless transmission device for multi-screen display.

Open your notification panel. Under **Shortcuts**, touch 🖨, select the receiving device and start the multi-screen display.

Huawei Beam

Huawei Beam lets you quickly share data between two Near Field Communication (NFC) enabled phones. To beam a web page or contact to another phone, place the two phones back to back and touch the content.

This function is only available on phones that support NFC.

Turning on Huawei Beam

- 1. On the home screen, touch Settings then the All tab.
- 2. Under Wireless & networks, touch More.
- 3 Touch NFC
- 4. Touch the NFC switch to turn on NFC.
- 5. Touch Huawei Beam to enable Huawei Beam.

Sharing a web page or contact through Huawei Beam

Before you use Huawei Beam to share a web page or contact, make sure that both phones are not locked and that NFC and Huawei Beam are enabled.

- **1.** Select the web page or contact you want to share.
- **2.** Place the two phones back to back. After a connection has been set up, the phones play a tone and the web page or contact screen shrinks.
- **3.** Touch the shrunken screen to display its information on the other phone.

NFC Magic Tag

Magic Tag lets you use NFC tags to create various usage modes.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Top apps** > **Magic Tag**.
- **2.** Touch **New mode** and name the usage mode.
- **3.** Touch **Přidat úkoly** and select tasks for the mode.
- **4.** Touch $\sqrt{}$ to save the mode.
- **5.** Touch **Write to tag** and place an NFC tag near the back of your phone to write the settings into the tag.
- When creating a usage mode, you can copy the settings of an existing mode by touching Import from other modes.
 - To enable a mode, simply place the tag near the back of your phone.

Applications

Managing applications

Downloading applications

A wide selection of applications are available from a variety of sources. You can:

- Download applications from App Centre.
- Download applications from web pages using the browser on your phone.
- Download applications using a computer, and copy the applications to your phone.
- Connect the phone to a computer, and download applications using a third-party application.

Installing an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔒 Files.
- 2. Under Categories, touch Apps.
- **3.** In the application list, touch the application you want to install and follow the onscreen prompts to install it.
- During the installation, read **Install blocked** carefully when prompted and follow the subsequent onscreen prompts.

Installing an application

- **1.** On the home screen, touch and hold the application you want to share until \mathcal{L}_{o} is displayed at the top of the screen.
- **2.** Drag the application to \mathcal{L}_{\circ} .
- **3.** On the displayed screen, select a sharing method and follow the onscreen prompts to share the application.

System applications can't be shared.

Uninstalling an application

- Some pre-installed applications can't be uninstalled.

Backup

Backing up data to local storage

By default, backup data is saved to the **HuaweiBackup** folder in **Files**.

On some phone models, backup files can be encrypted and passwordprotected. You need to enter a password to access encrypted backup files.

Backing up data to a USB storage device

Connect a USB storage device to your phone using a USB OTG cable. Make sure your phone can detect the USB storage device.

Restoring data from a USB storage device

Connect a USB storage device to your phone using a USB OTG cable. Make sure your phone can detect the USB storage device.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > **Backup**.
- 2. Touch \equiv > Back up to USB storage.
- **3.** Select the backup file you want to restore. You can use the file backup time as a reference.
- **4.** If the backup file has been encrypted, enter the password when prompted and then touch **OK**.
- **5.** Select the data you want to restore and touch **Restore**.

Smart Controller

Your phone comes with an infrared sensor, which enables you to use your phone as a remote control for various home appliances, including TVs, settop boxes (STBs), air conditioners and DVD players.

 \bigcirc On the remote control list screen, touch \equiv > **Help** for information about using the Smart Controller.

Adding a remote control

Your phone's Smart Controller is compatible with a number of different home appliances. Add a remote control for a supported home appliance to control it with your phone.

- 1. On the home screen, touch Tools > Smart Controller.
- **2.** Touch + .
- 3. Select a type of home appliance.
- **4.** Select a brand.
- 5. Point the infrared sensor at the top of your phone towards the target home appliance. Follow the onscreen prompts to test the keys.
 If the home appliance responds correctly after you touch a key, touch Yes and test other keys.
- 6. After all keys have been tested, touch OK.

Customising a remote control

You can customise a remote control for a home appliance if no default remote controls are available.

- 1. On the home screen, touch Tools > Smart Controller.
- 2. Touch \pm > Customise.
- **3.** Slide your finger across the screen to select the remote control you want to customise.
- **4.** Touch the key you want to program.
- **5.** Point the infrared sensor of the target remote control towards the infrared sensor at the top of your phone. Then press and hold the corresponding button on the target remote control for more than 2 seconds.
- **6.** After the key has been programmed, touch **Save**.
- **7.** Repeat steps 4, 5 and 6 to program all keys. Touch To save your settings.

When customising a remote control, make sure the infrared sensor of the target remote control and that of your phone are about 5 cm apart.

Deleting a remote control

Phone Manager

Phone Manager is a free system management application that helps you protect and manage your phone. With Phone Manager, you can:

- Optimise system performance by diagnosing your phone, cleaning trash files and more
- Enable power saving mode to maximise your phone's standby time.
- Block unwanted calls, message and notifications.
- Services and functions provided by Phone Manager vary according to your country and network operator.

Optimising the system

You can check and make your phone run more smoothly and quickly using Phone Manager.

On the home screen, touch **Phone Manager**. You can then:

- Touch **Scan** or **Touch to scan** to check your phone's running status, clean trash files, optimise system performance and eliminate security risks.
- Touch Phone accelerator to close power-intensive applications, scan for and clear the cache, trash files and unnecessary applications and application installation packages.

Power saving

- 1. On the home screen, touch Phone Manager.
- Touch Power saving to check your phone's power consumption and extend your phone's standby time. You can switch to different power saving modes as required.

Harassment filter

On the home screen, touch **Phone Manager**. You can then:

- Touch **Harassment filter** to set a blacklist to block unwanted messages and
- Touch **Notification manager** to block unwanted push notifications.
- Turn on **Do not disturb**. Your phone will only ring when you receive calls from authorised contacts. Tones for other calls, message tones and other notification tones will be muted.

Calendar

Calendar is your personal assistant that helps you manage, arrange and keep track of all the important events in your life. For example, you can plan your daily schedule in advance and view public holiday information. If you have saved birthday information for your contacts, Calendar automatically creates birthday reminders.

Creating an event

- **3.** Enter event details, such as the event name, start and end time, location and how often it repeats.

Viewing the calendar

- **(7)** GPS and time synchronisation may not be available on all phones.

Modifying tone settings

Changing the lock screen style

Face unlock

Use either of the following methods to turn Airplane mode on or off:

A personal identification number (PIN) is delivered with your SIM card to protect your phone data. If you enable the SIM card lock, you must enter the PIN each time you turn your phone on.

Before you perform the following operations, make sure you have obtained the PIN for your SIM card from your network operator.

⚠ Generally, SIM cards only allow a limited number of consecutive attempts if an incorrect PIN is entered. If this limit is exceeded, you must enter a PIN unblocking key (PUK), which you can obtain from your network operator. The number of consecutive PUK code attempts is also limited. If this limit is exceeded, your SIM card will be permanently disabled. For details about these limits, contact your network operator.

Restoring factory settings



Restoring your phone to the factory settings erases all your personal data from your phone storage, including information about your accounts, your system and application settings and downloaded applications. Back up important data on your phone before you restore factory settings.

- 3. Touch Factory data reset > Reset phone > Reset phone. The phone will be restored to factory settings before restarting.

Updating your phone



- Using unauthorised third-party software to update your phone may damage your phone or put your personal information at risk. It is recommended that you update through your phone's online update feature or download official update packages from Huawei's official website.
 - All your data may be erased during a system update. It is recommended that you back up important data before updating your phone.
