Setting Up the Message Inbox

You must set up your message inbox **before** you can send and receive messages.

Note: Usually, your service provider has already set up the message inbox for you.

Sending a Quick Note Text Message



Quick notes are prewritten text messages that you can send quickly (for example, **On my way**). You can also create new quick notes.

Sending a Multimedia Message



An MMS *multimedia message* contains one or more slides with text and embedded media objects, synchronized in a single presentation. You can send the message to other wireless

phone users, and to email addresses.

Tip: The layout of all slides is determined by the layout of the first slide to contain both text and a picture or video clip. Place the cursor in the first half of the slide text to insert a picture or video clip above the text. Place the cursor in the second half of the slide text to insert a picture or video clip below the text.

Using MMS Templates



MMS *templates* are multimedia message templates with preloaded media content. You can select an MMS template and use it as you would a multimedia message.

If a media object in a template cannot be edited, you will be unable to highlight the object.

Sending a Multimedia Letter



An MMS *letter* can contain media objects inserted within a text message, and/or media objects attached to the message. You can send the letter to other wireless phone users, and to

email addresses.

Viewing the Status of Sent Messages

Messages that you send are stored in the outbox.

Tips For Sending Messages

- Press to select a text entry method when you enter message text.
- When you enter a text message, a counter at the top
 of the display switches between the number of pages
 you have written (preceded by a *), and the number of
 characters left on the current page. Network charges
 are based on the number of pages sent.
- When you enter a multimedia message or letter, a counter at the top of the display shows the current message or letter size in bytes/kilobytes. Network charges are based on the size of the message/letter.
- When you manually enter phone numbers and/or email addresses in the Io field, you must insert a space between each entry. Press to the right to insert a space between each phone number or email address.

Receiving a Message



When you receive a message, your phone displays the ☐ (message waiting) indicator and a New Message notification, and sounds an alert.

If reminders are turned on, your phone sends a reminder at regular intervals until you close the new message notification, read the message, or turn off your phone. When your phone displays **Memory is Full!**, you must delete some existing messages from your inbox, outbox, or drafts folder to receive new messages.

Multimedia messages that you receive can contain different media objects:

- Photos, pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file or video clip begins playing when its slide is displayed. Use the volume keys to adjust the volume as the sound file or video clip plays.

Note: In a multimedia letter, you may have to highlight an indicator embedded in the text to play a sound file or video clip.

Attached files are added to the end of the message.
 To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator/filename and press VIEW (♥) (image file type), PLAY (♥) (sound file or video clip), or OPEN (♥) (vObject such as phonebook or datebook entry, or unknown file type).

Reading, Locking, or Deleting a Message

Using AOL[®] Instant Messenger™



AOL Instant Messenger (AIM®) lets you exchange short messages, in real time, with other users who are signed on to AIM from their phones or PCs.



Setting Up AOL Instant Messenger

Adding and Removing Buddies

Your Buddy List can contain 30 names.

To add a name, open your **Buddy List** or a conversation and press \nearrow > **Add Buddy**. If you are not in a conversation, enter the new screen name and press **OK** (\bigcirc). **AIM** returns an error if it cannot verify the name on the server.

Tip: To send a message to someone not on your **Buddy List**, open the list and press \searrow > **Send IM To**...

Declining Buddies

To decline messages from someone on your **Buddy List**, highlight the name and press \nearrow > **Decline IMs**. This setting remains active until you sign off of **AIM**.

Setting an Alert for Offline Buddies

To receive notification when someone signs on to AIM, highlight the name in your Buddy List and press > AIPT Me.

Setting Your Away Message

If you are signed on to **AIM** but not responding to new messages, you can set the 1 (away) indicator to display next to your name in everyone else's **Buddy List**. From the **AIM Online** menu, select **Away Message** > **On** or **Off**.

Note: The **AIM Online** menu displays when you sign on, and when you press **BACK** (\bigcirc) from your **Buddy List**.

Setting Your AIM Alert

AIM plays an alert when new messages arrive, or when a person for whom you have set an alert signs on to **AIM**.

To turn off the AIM alert, select Settings > Set Sounds from the AIM Online menu.

Changing Your Password

To change the password for your sign-on name, select **Settings > Change Password** from the **AIM Online** menu.

Signing Off of AIM

To sign off, select **Sign Off** from the **AIM Online** menu.



TTY Operation

- Set the phone volume to level 4 (middle setting) for proper operation. If you experience a high number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as necessary to minimize the error rate.
- For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) away from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

Using DTMF Tones

You can send numbers to the network as *Dual Tone Multi-Frequency* (DTMF) tones during a call. Use DTMF tones to communicate with automated systems that require you to submit a PIN code or credit card number.

Short sends a short fixed-duration tone for each keypress. **Long** sends each tone for as long as you press the key. Short DTMF tones work with most automated systems. Some systems (such as home answering machines) may require long tones for proper activation.

The amount of network connection time you track on your resettable timer may not equal the amount of time for which you are billed by your service provider. For billing information, please contact your service provider directly.

Your phone includes an integrated handsfree speaker that you can use for handsfree applications. For instructions on how to use the handsfree speaker, see your *Start Here* guide.

You can also purchase an optional Motorola Original™ handsfree car kit, speakerphone, or headset for your phone. These accessories provide alternative ways for you to use your phone without using your hands.

If the accessory supports Bluetooth™ wireless connections, you can setup a Bluetooth wireless link with your phone (see page 32).

Note: The use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

Making Data and Fax Calls



An optional Motorola Original data kit (which includes a cable connector) lets you transfer data between your phone and a computer, Palm OS[®] compatible device, or Microsoft Windows CE,

Pocket PC, or Handheld PC device. You can:

- Synchronize phonebook and datebook information between your phone and a computer or PDA.
- Use your phone as a modem to connect to the Internet.
- Use your phone to send and receive data and fax calls from your computer or handheld device.

Making a Cable Connection

Installing the Software

To transfer data between your phone and computer, you must install the software included with the Motorola Original data kit. See the data kit user's guide for more information.

Attaching the Cable

Use a Motorola Original serial cable or Motorola Original USB cable to connect your phone to the external device.


Note: Not all devices are compatible with a cable connection. Check your computer or hand-held device to determine the type of cable you need.

Serial Cable

Action

1 Plug the serial cable into the detachable head.

Make sure that the Motorola logo on the detachable head and the metal shielding on the serial cable plug are both facing you.





3 Plug the other end of the cable into the serial interface connection on the device and tighten the screws, if present.

USB Cable

Plug the end of the cable with the Motorola logo into the phone's accessory connector port. Make sure that the logo and the phone are both facing you.



2 Plug the other end—the USB connection—into the USB port on the device.

Making a Wireless Connection

If the other device supports Bluetooth™ wireless connections, you can set up a Bluetooth wireless link with your phone. See the following section.

Note: Not all devices are compatible with a Bluetooth connection. Check your external device for specifications.

Synchronizing Data

You can synchronize phonebook and datebook information between your phone, computer, and PDA with BVRP Mobile PhoneTools software, an accessory for Motorola phones. See the Mobile PhoneTools user's guide for more information.

Note: BVRP Mobile PhoneTools software is designed to synchronize with basic features of many popular Personal Information Management (PIM) software and hardware products.

Sending a Data or Fax Call

Use this procedure to send data or a fax from a connected computer or hand-held device using a CSD or GPRS network connection.

Action

- 1 Make sure that the phone is connected and powered on.
- 2 Open the application (such as dial-up-networking or fax) on your computer, and place the call through the application.

Note: You cannot dial data or fax numbers through your phone's keypad. You must dial them through your computer, unless you are making a talk then fax call (see following section).

3 When the transfer is complete, end the call from the connected device to close the connection.

Receiving a Data or Fax Call

Use this procedure to transfer data or a fax to a connected computer or hand-held device.

Transferring the Data or Fax

Your phone notifies you when the data or fax call arrives, and transfers the call to the connected device. Use the application running on the device to answer the call.

Ending the Data/Fax Connection

When the data or fax transfer is complete, end the call from the connected device to close the connection.

Making a Talk Then Fax Call



You can place a call where you talk and then send a fax to the same phone number within the same call.

Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless connections. You can set up a wireless link with a Bluetooth-enabled headset accessory, speakerphone, or handsfree car kit, or connect to a computer or hand-held device to exchange and synchronize data.

Your phone supports the following Bluetooth device profiles:

- headset
- handsfree
- dial-up networking
- · object exchange
- file transfer

Searching For Other Devices

To connect your phone to a headset accessory or external device:

Find the Feature

> Settings > Connection

- > Bluetooth Link
- > Handsfree
- > [Look For Devices]

Your phone presents a list of device(s) located within range of the phone. If your phone is already connected to a device, your phone lists the connected device and identifies it with a \checkmark (in use) indicator.

To connect to a device, highlight the device name and press **SELECT** (\bigcirc) .

The device may request permission to bond with your phone. Select YES (\bigcirc) and enter the correct PIN code to create a secure connection with the device. When the connection is made, the (Bluetooth) indicator or a **Bluetooth Connected** message displays in the home screen.

Making Your Phone Visible to Other Devices

To allow an unknown Bluetooth device to discover and connect to your phone:

Find the Feature

> Settings > Connection > Bluetooth Link > Setup > Find Me

The (Bluetooth) indicator or **Bluetooth Waiting** message flashes, and the phone goes into discoverable mode until a connection is made, or until 60 seconds elapse.

The device may request permission to bond with your phone. Select **YES** (\bigcirc) and enter the correct PIN code to create a secure connection with the device.

Connecting to Recognized Devices

Your phone stores the names of previously connected devices, and lists the recognized devices located within range of the phone when you open the **Handsfree** menu. If your phone is already connected to a device, your phone lists the connected device and identifies it with a **\(\frac{1}{2}\)** (in use) indicator.

To connect to a recognized handsfree device:

Find the Feature

> Settings > Connection > Bluetooth Link > Handsfree > device name

For a Motorola headset or other audio device, your phone automatically attempts to connect to the device.

Disconnecting From a Device

The device connected to your phone is identified with a \checkmark (in use) indicator. To disconnect from the device, highlight the device name and press **DROP** (\bigcirc).

Switching To a Headset Or Car Kit During a Call

You can switch to a headset or car kit audio device during a call, either from the audio device or from your phone.

Switching From the Audio Device

To connect to your phone from a headset or car kit audio device, press the device's Bluetooth button to route all audio to the device.

Switching From Your Phone

To connect your phone to a recognized headset or car kit audio device, press > Iso Bluetooth during a call to route all audio to the device. Your phone attempts to reconnect to the most recently used audio device.

To switch back to the phone, press > **Use Handset** during a call to route all audio back to the phone.



Copying Objects to Another Device

You can use a Bluetooth wireless connection to copy a picture, sound, phonebook entry, datebook event, or bookmark from your phone to another phone, computer, or hand-held device.

Copying a Media Object

Highlight the object on your phone that you want to copy to the other device, then press $\nabla \mathbb{I} > \text{Copy}$.

Select a recognized device name listed in the **Object Exchange** menu, or **|Look For Devices**| to search for the device to which you want to copy the object.

Copying a Phonebook Entry, Datebook Event, or Bookmark

Highlight the item on your phone that you want to copy to the other device, then press $\nearrow \nearrow >$ **Send** > **Bluetooth**.

Select a recognized device name listed in the **Object Exchange** menu, or **|Look For Devices**| to search for the device to which you want to copy the item.

Editing Device Properties

To edit the properties of a recognized device, highlight the device name and press \nearrow > **Edit**. You can edit the following options:

Option	Description
Name	The name of the device as it displays in the device list.
Access	Determines how a device connects to the phone:
	Automatic: Device is automatically connected to the phone without user interaction.
	Ask : Device must request permission to connect.

Setting Your Phone's Bluetooth Options

Editing Sounds with MotoMixer


MotoMixer lets you edit and save special MIDI-based sound files called *Groove Tunes* on your phone. These sound files are made up of 4 instruments such as **piano**, **bass**, **drums**, and **guitar**. The phone comes preloaded with base tracks (which you cannot edit or delete), but you can download others and use them all to create or edit your own mix files. The mix files you create display in the list of available alerts.



Press the keypad keys to set note length, enter rests, and enter or edit note information. If necessary, press a keypad key multiple times to cycle through its available options.

Tip: Press > **Play All** at any time to play the notes you have entered.

Your phone identifies each note by **octave** (*0 through *8), **note** (a through 1), with sharp notes preceded by a #), and note **length** (0 through 5). For example, a C# quarter note in octave 4 displays as *4#62.

Each note must contain the following information, in the following sequence: **octave**, **note**, **length**, and length **modifier** (optional).

Octave

Enter * before a number to identify it as an octave value. Octave information (*0 to *8) must come **before** the note. If you do not specify an octave, the note is played as an octave 4 note.
