## About this guide

When using this guide, please notice that features of the device may vary slightly depending on the model and software version you have, and on your location, language, and Internet service provider. All screenshots, images, parameters and descriptions documented in this guide are used for demonstration only.

#### **Conventions**

In this guide, the following conventions are used:



#### 1.2 Buttons

The buttons you use with Neffos include virtual ones and physical ones.

#### **Power button**

 Lock Neffos: Press the Power button to manually lock the screen. Locking your phone puts the display to sleep, saves the battery and prevents unmeant operations on the screen. You can still receive phone calls, text messages, alarms and notifications as well as listening to music and adjusting the volume. Neffos locks the screen automatically in a given period of inactivity. To adjust the time, go to Settings -> Display -> Automatically lock.

- Unlock Neffos: Press the Power button to wake the screen. For additional security, you can require a pattern, PIN, password or fingerprint to unlock you phone. Go to Screen lock to choose a safe way to unlock your phone.
- Turn Neffos on: Press and hold the Power button until your phone vibrates and the screen turns on.
- Turn Neffos off: Press and hold the Power button, then tap ( Power off.

#### Note:

If your phone does not respond after holding down the Power button for 10 seconds, the battery may be empty. Connect your phone to a charger to charge the battery.

#### Volume button

You can adjust the audio volume when you're on the phone or listening to songs, movies or other media. You can also use Volume button to take a picture or record a video. Refer to <u>Take a photo</u> and <u>Record a video</u> to learn more.

#### Home button

Touch Home button to return to the default Home screen.

#### **Back button**

Touch Back button to return to the previous screen or close an application. When entering text, touch to close the onscreen keyboard.

#### **Recent apps button**

Touch Recent apps button to display recently used applications.

#### 1.3 Put in the cards


#### Insert Nano SIM cards and Nano SD card (optional)

With your phone turned off, eject the SIM card tray by inserting a paper clip or the pin provided into the hole on the tray. Place the the SIM card(s) and SD card (optional) into the tray with the gold contacts face down and then insert the tray back into the phone.

#### Note:

- 1. Your phone only supports nano-SIM cards. Contact your carrier for a new or replacement nano-SIM card. You can insert 2 nano-SIM cards, or 1 nano-SIM card and 1 micro-SD card. For more information, see *Dual SIM settings*.
- 2. Please exercise caution when using the SIM ejector pin to avoid hurting your fingers or damaging your phone. Store your pin in a safe place out of the reach of children to prevent accidental swallowing or injury.

### 1.4 Initial setup

Press and hold the Power button to turn on your phone, and then follow the onscreen instructions to complete the initial setup. It is recommended to insert your SIM card before you start the initial setup.

- 1. Select your language, and then tap  $\rightarrow$ .
- 2. Proceed to the **Set up SIM cards** screen. Follow the onscreen instruction to select a SIM for cellular data, calls and text messages and then tap **NEXT**.
  - If you have not inserted your SIM card before the initial setup, your phone will proceed to **Insert SIM** cards in this step. Then you can insert your SIM card first. For more information, see <u>Put in the cards</u>. If you do not want to insert your SIM card now, tap **SKIP** to move to the next step.
- 3. Proceed to the **Select WLAN network** screen. Your phone will automatically list available Wi-Fi networks. Select the network you want to connect to, and then enter the password to access the Internet. (This can take up to 2 minutes.) Or you can tap **SKIP** -> **SKIP ANYWAY** and move to next step.
- 4. Proceed to the **Date & time** screen. Choose the desired time and then tap **NEXT**.
- 5. Proceed to the **Name** screen. Add your name to allow your phone to personalize some apps. Then tap **NEXT**.
- 6. Pcoceed to **Protect your phone** screen. Select a protection feature and then follow the onscreen instructions to complete. If you don't want to set now, tap **No, thanks** and tap **SKIP** -> **SKIP ANYWAY**.
- 7. Pcoceed to **Google services** screen. Turn on the desired services and tap **NEXT**.
- 8. Setup completed. Now you can start using your phone.

## 1. 5 Charge your phone

Connect the device to a power outlet using the included USB cable and power adapter.

- 1. Connect the USB cable into the Charging port.
- 2. Connect the USB cable to the power adapter, then plug the power adapter into a power outlet.
- 3. When the battery is full, unplug the power adapter from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from

#### your phone.

#### Note:

- 1. The battery is built into the phone and is not removable. Do not attempt to remove the battery yourself.
- 2. It is entirely normal that your phone may become warm after prolonged use or when exposed to high ambient temperatures. If your phone becomes hot to the touch, stop charging it and disable unnecessary features. Place your phone in a cool location and allow it to cool down to room temperature. Avoid prolonged contact with the surface of your phone if it becomes hot.
- 3. When charging your phone, only use genuine Neffos batteries, chargers, and USB cables. Third-party accessories are a potential safety hazard and may impair your phone's performance. Avoid using your phone when it is charging. Do not cover your phone or the power adapter.
- 4. A low battery warning will be displayed when the battery level is low. Your phone will turn off automatically when the battery is nearly empty.
- 5. Charging times may vary depending on the ambient temperature and the remaining battery level.



## 2. 1 Touchscreen gestures

Use simple touchscreen gestures to perform a variety of tasks, such as open applications, scroll through lists, and zoom images.


**Touch:** Simply tap an item once. For example, touch to select an option or open an application.




**Touch and hold:** Touch and leave your finger on the screen for 2 seconds or more to activate onscreen items. For example, touch and hold a widget on the Home screen to move it.




**Swipe:** Place your finger on the screen, and drag your finger to the direction you want. For example, in the Notifications panel, swipe left or right on a notification to dismiss it. Swipe vertically or horizontally to go to other home screens, scroll through a document, and more.




**Drag:** Touch and hold an item and then move it to another position. For example, you can rearrange applications and widgets on the Home screen.



**Zoom out:** Pinch two fingers together on the screen. For example, pinch two fingers together to zoom out on a picture or a web page.




**Zoom in:** Spread two fingers apart on the screen. For example, pinch two fingers out to zoom on a picture or a web page.



## 2. 2 Home screen

Your home screens are where you can find your favorite widgets and all your applications.



Status bar: Displays notifications and status icons.

Widget: Self-contained applications that run on the Home screen (not shortcuts).

APP screen indicator: Indicates which screen is displayed.

APP shortcuts: Shortcuts to your favorite applications.

#### Organize applications and widgets on the Home screen

On the Home screen, pinch two fingers together or touch and hold a blank area on the screen to access the Home screen editor. You can:

• Add a widget to the Home screen

Add frequently used widgets to the Home screen for guick access.

- 1. On the Home screen, pinch two fingers together to open the Home screen editor.
- 2. Tap Widgets and select a widget. Touch and hold the widget and drag it to a blank area on the Home screen.
- 3. Tap a blank area on the Home screen to quit the Home screen editor.

#### Note:

You must have enough space on the Home screen to add widgets. If there is not enough space, add another Home screen or free up some space.

#### · Move a widget or icon

On the Home screen, touch and hold an application icon or widget and then drag them to the desired location.

#### • Delete a widget or icon

On the Home screen, touch and hold the application or widget you want to delete and then tap  $\times$  on the top left corner of the icon.

#### · Create a folder

Create Home screen folders to organize your applications by type. For example, you can create a Gameras folder that contains all of your camera applications.

- 1. On the Home screen, drag an icon on top of another icon to create a folder containing both applications.
- 2. To rename the folder, open the Home screen editor, touch the folder, tap **Unnamed Folder**, and then enter the folder name.

#### 2. 3 Status icons

The icons in the status bar at the top of the screen diaplay information about your phone's status.



## 2.4 Quick settings panel

Swipe down from the top of any screen twice to open the Quick settings panel.

■ Note: On the Lock screen, swipe only once to open the Quick settings panel.



Touch the shortcut switches on the Quick settings panel to enable or disable the functions.


- 1. **Settings:** Tap to configure the settings.
- 2. **WLAN:** Tap to enable WLAN.
- 3. **Airplane mode:** Tap to enable airplane mode.
- 4. **Flashlight:** Tap to enable flashlight.

- 5. **Brightness slider:** Use this slider to adjust the brightness of the screen.
- 6. **Bluetooth:** Tap to enable Bluetooth.
- 7. **Mobile data:** Tap to enable mobile data.
- 8. **Rotation:** Tap to open auto-ratate which can switch the touchscreen from portrait to landscape when you rotate your phone.
- 9. **Location:** Tap to enable location service.
- 10. **Battery saver:** Tap to enable battery saver.
- 11. **Do not disturb:** Tap to silence your phone.
- 12. **Edit:** Tap to enter the edit page. You can drag the shotcut switches on the edit page to/from Quick settings panel.
- 13. **Float button:** Tap to enable the float button.
- 14. **Screenshot:** Tap to make a screenshot.
- 15. **Hotspot:** Tap to enable hotspot.
- 16. **Silent:** Tap to enable ringer mode.

## 2.5 Notification panel

Notification panel collects all the notifications and alerts so that you can review them whenever you like.

- Open Notification panel: Swipe down from the status bar to open the Notification panel.
- View a notification: Tap an item to view the details. Or swipe the notification left or right to remove it from the list. ( New notifications, such as missed calls and messages are displayed on the Lock screen. Double-tap it to view the details.)
- Close Notification panel: Swipe up, or press the Back button or Home button.



#### **Notification management**

Go to Settings -> Notification manager, select the desired application. You can:


- Allow notifications: Turn the switch **Allow notifications** off to disable notifications for the application so as to prevent unnecessary disturbances. Turn the switch on to enable notifications for the application.
- Treat as priority: Let this application's notifications to be heard when Do not disturb is set to Priority only.
- Banners: Peek these notifications into view on the current screen.

Go to Settings -> Notification manager -> : -> Notifications, you can choose whether to show all notification content, or whether to hide sensitive content, or to do not show notifications at all when the device is locked.

### 2.6 Type text

#### **Enter text**

Use Android input method to enter text.



- 1. Tap  $\bigoplus$ , or touch  $\bigoplus$  and slide to a letter to type uppercase. Double-tap  $\bigoplus$  for caps lock.
- 2. Enter numbers, punctuations and symbols.
- 3. Enter a comma.
  - Tap and hold to open the input options menu.
- 4. If you have several keyboards, you can tap to switch to the last one you used. You can also touch and hold it to choose the keyboard you need.
- 5. Enter a space, or double-tap the space bar quickly to end a sentence with a period.
- 6. Enter a period.
  - Tap and hold to enter a symbol.
- 7. Enter emoticon.
- 8. Delete the characters to the left of the cursor.

#### **Edit text**

- Revise text: Tap the text to position the insertion point **a** and start revising.
- Select text: Tap and hold the text field to display the selection options(cut/copy/share/select all). Drag to select more or less text.

#### Spell checker

You can turn on the Spell checker feature to help you enter correct words.

- 1. Go to Settings -> Language & input -> Spell checker.
- 2. Turn the switch on.

#### Switch input method

1. On the Home screen, tap **Settings** -> **Language & input** -> **Keyboard & input methods**.

2. Select an input method you need.

#### 2. 7 Take a screenshot

Press the Power and Volume down buttons at the same time to take a full screenshot.

### 2.8 Configure your fingerprint

Use the fingerprint sensor to unlock the screen, take photos, unlock apps and authorize payments in third-party applications.

#### Add a fingerprint for the first time

For added security and to ensure that you can still access your data if your phone fails to recognize your fingerprint, you will need to set a backup screen lock method when configuring fingerprint unlock.

- Go to Settings -> Fingerprint and encryption -> Fingerprint.
- Select Pattern or PIN or Password, and then follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen lock password.
- 3. Once you have configured the password, tap **Add fingerprint**.
- 4. Place your fingertip on the fingerprint sensor. Press down lightly on the sensor until your phone vibrates. Repeat this step using different parts of your fingertip until your phone has successfully added your fingerprint.
- 5. Once you have added your fingerprint, tap **DONE**.

#### Note

When recording your fingerprint, make sure the fingerprint sensor and your fingers are dry and clean.

#### Add, delete or rename your fingerprint

Add multiple fingerprints to make it easier to unlock your phone. You can also delete or rename your fingerprints.

- 1. Go to Settings -> Fingerprint and encryption -> Fingerprint.
- 2. Enter the screen lock pattern/password/PIN.
- 3. In the Fingerprint list section, you can:
  - Tap **Add fingerprint** to add a new fingerprint. You can add up to five in total.
  - Tap a previously added fingerprint to rename or delete it.

#### Use fingerprint to take photos or record videos

When using the camera, touch the fingerprint sensor to take a picture or record a video.

- 1. Go to **☼ Settings** -> **Fingerprint and encryption** -> **Touch function**.
- 2. Turn the **Take photos** switch on.

#### Use fingerprint to access locked applications

Use a Pattern, PIN, Password or fingerprint to lock the selected app(s) to ensure privacy.

- 1. Go to Settings -> Fingerprint and encryption -> Encryption -> App lock.
- 2. Turn on the switch and then choose **Fingerprint**. Choose the apps that you want to use fingerprint to unlock and turn the switch on. Then you will need to use your fingerprint unlock the selected apps before you can access them.

## 2.9 Change the theme

Personalize your phone's Home screen using a wide range of themes and wallpapers.

- 1. On the Home screem, tap **Themes**, select a theme, and then tap **APPLY**.
- 2. Tap and you can select the theme packs, wallpapers, icons, sounds, fonts, boot animations and system style.

## 2. 10 Access applications

#### Launch and switch between applications

- From the Home screen: touch an icon to launch the corresponding application.
- From the Locked screen: Swipe o up to launch the camera application.
- Switch to another application: touch the Home button to return to the Home screen, and then touch the icon of the application you want to open.

#### Viewing recently used applications

Touch Recent apps button to display the list of recently used applications.

- View more applications: Swipe up or down on the screen to view more recently used applications.
- Open an application: Touch a thumbnail to open the corresponding application.
- Close an application: Swipe left or right on a thumbnail to close the corresponding application, or you can tap 

  x on a thumbnail to close it.

#### **Uninstall applications**

Free up space on your phone and boost performance by removing unused applications.

On the Home screen, tap and hold the application you want to uninstall and tap  $\otimes$ . You can also go to **Settings** -> **Apps**, select the application you want to uninstall and touch **UNINSTALL**.

Some pre-installed system applications cannot be removed.

# 3 Connection

Share your phone data with others by various kinds of connections.

- Connect to Internet
- Connect to computer
- Bluetooth
- Share your mobile data with other devices

#### 3. 1 Connect to Internet

Connect to the Internet using Wi-Fi or mobile data to surf the web, play games, and use instant messaging applications.

#### Connect to a WLAN network

If  $extbf{$igoplus}$  appears in the status bar, you are connected to a Wi-Fi network. Neffos reconnects anytime you return to the same location.

- 1. Swipe down from the status bar (except for the Lock screen) twice to open the Quick settings panel.
- 2. Tap and hold **WLAN** to open the WLAN settings screen.
- 3. Tap the switch to turn it on. A list of available Wi-Fi networks will be displayed.
- 4. Select the Wi-Fi network you want to connect to, and then enter the password if needed. (You can also turn Wi-Fi on in Settings -> WLAN.)

#### Connect to mobile data

- 1. Swipe down from the status bar (except for the Lock screen) twice to open the Quick settings panel.
- 2. Tap and hold 1 to enter the cellular data settings.
- 3. Tap the switch to turn it on. (You can also tap 1). When it lights up, mobile data is enabled.)

#### Note:

- 1. Before using mobile data, ensure that you have a data plan with your carrier.
- 2. If a Wi-Fi connection to the Internet isn't available, apps and services may transfer data over your carrier's cellular network, which may result in additional fees. Contact your carrier for information about you cellular data plan rates.
- 3. Disable mobile data when not required in order to save battery power and reduce data usage.

## 3. 2 Connect to computer

Transfer the data on your phone to your computer or transfer the data on your computer to your phone.

- 1. Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable.
- 2. On the notification panel, tap **USB for charging**.
- 3. Select a USB connection mode (Charging/File transfers/Photo transfer(PTP)/MIDI) depending on your needs. (If no connection type is specified, your phone will remain in charging mode.)

#### 3.3 Bluetooth

You can share data on your phone with other devices using Bluetooth.

#### Enable Bluetooth and pair your phone with another device

- 1. Swipe down from the status bar (except for the Lock screen) twice to open the Quick settings panel.
- 2. Tap and hold **% Blutooth** to enter the Bluetooth settings. Tap the switch to turn it on. Your phone will automatically list available devices. If the device you want to pair with is not displayed, check that the device is discoverable.
- 3. Select the device you want to pair with and follow the onscreen instructions. (You can also turn Bluetooth on in Settings -> Bluetooth).

#### Send and receive files using Bluetooth

Check that both devices are paired before attempting to transfer files.

- Send files: Touch and hold the file you want to send and tap <> Bluetooth. Your device will automatically search for nearby devices. Select the receiving device.
- Receive files: When another device tries to send you files using Bluetooth, select **ACCEPT** from the dialog box that appears. Open the Notification panel to view file transfer progress. By default, received files are saved to the Bluetooth folder on your device's internal storage.

#### **Unpair Bluetooth devices**

- Go to Settings -> Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap the cicon next to the paired device, and then tap **FORGET**.

#### Rename your phone

- 2. Tap the switch to turn it on.
- 3. Tap: -> Rename this device.
- 4. Edit the device name and tap **RENAME** to complete the settings.

## 3. 4 Share your mobile data with other devices

You can share your phone's mobile Internet with other devices (such as phones, tablets, or computers). The following Internet sharing methods can be used:

#### Use USB tethering

Use a USB cable to share your phone's mobile Internet with a computer. This is useful if your computer's Internet connection stops working. To enable mobile data, see *Connect to mobile data*.

- 1. Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable.
- 2. On the Home screen, tap Settings -> Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3. Tap the **USB tethering** switch to turn it on. After enabling USB tethering, your phone will display the  $\psi$  icon in the status bar. You can then use the computer to access the Internet.

#### Note:

Depending on your computer's operating system, you may need to install phone drivers on the computer or establish a network connection in order to use USB tethering. Please read the instructions for your operating system.

#### **Use WLAN hotspot**

Set up a portable Wi-Fi hotspot to share your phone's mobile Internet with other devices. Compared with Bluetooth tethering, the portable Wi-Fi hotspot feature offers quicker, longer range connections, but power consumption is higher.

On the Home screen, tap ♥ Settings -> Tethering & portable hotspot.

- 2. Tap **WLAN hotspot** and then turn the switch on.
  - After enabling your personal Wi-Fi hotspot, your phone will display icon (a) and (b) in the status bar.
- 3. Tap **Set up WLAN hotspot** to set the hotspot name, security and password, and then tap **SAVE**.
  - Change the hotspot name: The **Network name** is the hotspot name. By default, this is the name of your phone model. You can manually change the name to something that is easier to remember.
  - Change the security setting: Tap **Security** to configure security setting. Your phone uses **WPA2 PSK** encryption by default. Other devices will require a password to connect to the hotspot. If you choose None, devices will not require a password to connect to the hotspot.
  - Configure a password that is easy to remember: The hotspot password is generated randomly by your phone. For security reasons, choose a password that is not easy to guess.
  - Select a AP band: Select 2.4GHz Band or 5GHz Band.
  - Configure the maximum number of connections: Touch **Maximum connections** to change the maximum number of connections. Your phone will allow up to eight users to connect to the hotspot.

#### Note:

Your device can't access the Internet using Wi-Fi when your Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is turned on.

#### **Use Bluetooth tethering**

Use Bluetooth tethering to turn your phone into a wireless router and share your mobile Internet with other devices. Compared with a portable hotspot, Bluetooth tethering offers a slower Internet connection, but consumes less power.

- 1. Establish a Bluetooth connection between two devices and check that they are paired. For more information, see *Enable Bluetooth and pair your phone with another device*.
- 2. On the Home screen, tap Settings -> Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3. Turn on the **Bluetooth tethering** switch to share your mobile Internet.
- 4. Go to **Settings** ->**Bluetooth** and touch the device you want to connect. After enbling Bluetooth tethering, your phone will display the ★ icon in the status bar. Other devices can now connect and use your mobile data.

#### 4.1 Make a call

#### Dial directly from the dialer

#### Dial a recent number from the Dial

All incoming, outgoing and missed call are in the Dial.

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Phone** -> **Dial**, a list of recent calls will be displayed.
- 2. Tap a number to call. If you have inserted two SIM cards, choose SIM1 or SIM2 to dial.

#### Note:

If you want to make SIM1 or SIM 2 as the default SIM card to make calls or if you want to deactivate one of them, go to **Settings** -> **SIM cards** to configure. For more information, see <u>SIM cards</u>.

#### Dial from contact list

- On the Home screen, tap Phone -> Contacts.
- 2. Tap a contact and then tap the number to dial. If your phone supports dual SIM cards, choose SIM1 or SIM2 to make the call.


#### Make an international call

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Phone** -> (ii).
- 2. Tap and hold **0** to enter **+**, then enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number in sequence.
- 3. Tap 🔇 If you have inserted two SIM cards, choose SIM1 or SIM2 to make a call.

## 4. 2 Answer or reject a call


On the incoming call screen:

#### When the screen is locked:



- Drag ( right to answer the call.
- Drag 🔾 left to reject the call.
- Touch **t** to reject the call and send SMS.

#### When the screen is unlocked:



- Touch **to answer the call.**
- Touch to reject the call.
- Touch **=** to reject the call and send SMS.

#### ■ Note:

- 1. When a call comes in, you can press the Volume button to mute the ringtone.
- 2. Go to **Phone** -> : -> **Settings** -> **Quick responses** to edit the predefined text messages.

## 4. 3 Options during a call

Your phone provides a variety of functions that you can use during a call.

#### In-call menu

During a call, your phone will display an in-call menu.



- 1. Mute the call.
- 2. Start a third-party call.
- 3. Place the current call on hold.
- 4. Enable hands-free mode.
- 5. Make notes during the call.
- 6. Record the call. (In some countries, recording during the call is illegal, so their phone may not have this feature.)
- 7. Open the dialer.
- 8. End the call.

Hide the in-call menu: Touch the Home button or Back button. To return to the in-call menu, slide down from the status bar to open the Notification panel and tap **Ongoing call**. To end the call, tap **HANG UP**.

#### Adjust the call volume

Press the Volume buttons to increase or decrease the volume.

#### Answer a third-party call

If you receive a call when already in another call, touch \( \subseteq \) to answer the call. The previous call will be holded on automatically.

#### Note:

Before using this feature, check that you have subscribed to a call hold service and enabled call waiting on your phone. For more details, contact your carrier.

## 4.4 Call log

All incoming, outgoing and missed calls are recorded in the call log. Missed calls are displayed in red.

#### Add a number from the call log.

Go to **Phone** -> **Dial** and select a number from the call log and save it to your contacts.

1. Tap in next to the number you want to add and then tap : -> Add a contact.

2. Tap **Create new contact**, fill in the information, and then tap ...

#### Clear the call log

- Clear one call history: Tap (i) next to the number you want to remove and then tap (i).
- Clear the whole call log: Tap : -> Call History -> : -> Clear call history.

## 4. 5 Call settings

Go to **Phone** -> **II** -> **Settings** to configure the following call settings.

- Display options: Choose the sort order and name format for your contacts.
- Sounds and vibration: Set ringtone for your SIM cards or tap the checkbox to enable **Also vibrate for calls** and **Dialpad tones**.
- Quick responses: Edit quick responses.
- Calling accounts: Configure your calling accounts and SIP settings.
- · Accessibility: Configure the accessibility settings.

#### Create a contact

- 1. On the Home screen, go to **Phone** -> 4.
- 2. Enter the contact's name, phone number and other information, and then tap . You can also go to . Contacts -> to add a new contact. For more information, see *Contacts*.

#### Note:

The number of contacts you can store on your phone depends on the size of your phone's internal storage. The maximum number of SIM card contacts may vary depending on your SIM card's storage capacity.

#### Harassment filter

The Harassment filter automatically blocks calls and messages from unknown or blacklisted sources.

Go to **Phone** -> -> Harassment filter to view the blocked messages and calls.

Tap to configure the following settings.

- Blacklist numbers: Add harassing numbers into the blacklist.
- Block unknown number: Turn on the switch to block unknown numbers.
- Block notification: Turn on the switch to get reminders when your phone intercepts a harassing call or spam message.

The Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) lets you send and receive multimedia messages (such as pictures, videos, and audio messages) to and from other mobile phones.

## 5. 2 Send messages

Spice up your messages by adding emoticons, images, videos, music, recordings, and more.

#### Delete a conversation

#### **Block spam messages**

- 1. On the Home screen, tap  $\blacksquare$  Messages ->  $\blacksquare$  -> Harassment filter to view blocked messages.
- 2. Tap to configure blacklist numbers. Turn on **Block notification** switch to make your phone send a notification to remind you when a harassing call or spam message is intercepted. Blocked messages are not shown in the message list.

#### 6. 1 Listen to music

On the Home screen, tap Music -> Songs and tap the song you want to play.

#### Add songs to your phone

Before you can listen to your music, you need to copy your songs onto your phone. To add songs to your phone, you can:

- Download songs from the Internet.
- Copy songs from your computer using the USB cable. For more information, see *Connect to computer*.
- Copy songs with Bluetooth. For more information, see <u>Send and receive files using Bluetooth</u>.

#### Create a playlist

- 1. Go to Music -> Playlists, tap + New playlist.
- 2. Enter a name for the new playlist and tap **SAVE**.
- 3. Check the box to choose the songs you want to add into the new playlist and then tap .

#### Play a playlist

- 1. Go to Music -> Playlists to play a playlist.
- 2. Select the desired playlist, and then touch a song to start playback, or touch **Shuffle all** to shuffle all songs.

#### Music equalizer

- 1. Go to **Music** -> **EQ**.
- 2. Turn the **Equalizer** switch to choose a number of equalizer settings.

#### Search for local music

Search with a keyword to find your music files quickly.

- 2. Enter a keyword to find your desired music.

## 6. 2 Playback screen

Touch the song that is playing to enter the playback screen. Swipe left or right to switch songs.



- 1. Playlist.
- 2. Play the previous song or go back to the beginning.
- 3. Pause the song.
- 4. Add song to favorites.
- 5. Change playback mode.
- 6. Play the next song.

#### Use your phone during playback screen

When a song is playing, touch the Home button to exit the music playback screen without stopping the song. To return to the music playback screen, open the notification panel and touch the song that is playing.

#### Control playback using headset

When smart headset control is enabled, you can use the buttons on a headset to control playback without turning on the screen. (Not all headsets are compatible with your phone.)

- Volume up button: Press once to increase the volume.
- Pause button: Press once to pause or resume playback.
- Volume down button: Press once to decrease the volume.

## 6.3 Play a video

- 6. Swipe left on the screen to apply a filter.
- 7. Night mode. For more information, see <u>Shooting modes</u>.
- 8. Beauty mode. For more information, see *Shooting modes*.
- 9. Switch between the back camera and front camera.
- 10. Take a timed photo. It is also available for the front camera.
- 11. Record a video. For more information, see *Record a video*.

## 7. 2 Take a photo

- 1. Tap (a) to choose the camera mode, frame the scene you want to capture, touch any part of the screen to focus on the corresponding area. (You can adjust the exposure on the slider beside the focus frame. Lock the exposure and focus by touch and hold the screen.) To adjust the focal length, pinch two fingers together or spread them apart on the screen.
- 2. Tap or press the Volume button to take a photo.
- 3. Tap  $\bigcirc$  to switch between the front camera and back camera.

#### Note:

You can also use burst mode to take continuous photos.

- 1. Tap and hold the or Volume button when taking a photo, you can take continuous photos.
- 2. Go to **Gallery** -> **Ablums** -> **Burst**, select a desired photo and tap **Select** on the screen, then you can view all the photos.

#### 7.3 Record a video

- 1. Tap to switch to Video mode, and then tap or press the Volume button to start a video recording. Touch the screen to focus on an object or area during recording. (You can adjust the exposure on the slider beside the focus frame. Lock the exposure and focus by touch and hold the screen.) Touch on the screen during recording to save the current scene as a photo.
- 2. Tap **(**) to stop and save recording.

## 7.4 Shooting modes

Your camera provides several photo and video modes for different shooting scenarios. Swipe right on the screen to change the capture mode.

**Camera(Auto):** Your phone is set to use camera mode by default. You can also tap **Camera**, swipe right on the screen and choose **CAMERA** mode.

**Panorama:** Use this mode to take wide-angle shots.

- 1) Tap **©** Camera, swipe right on the screen and choose **PANORAMA**.
- 2) Select a suitable location and hold your phone steady, and then tap 

  to start shooting.
- 3) Follow the onscreen instructions to take the photo. Slowly move your camera from left to right, ensuring that the arrow stays level with the center line.
- 4) Tap to stop recording. The camera automatically stitches the photos together to create one panoramic photograph.

**Slow-motion:** Record videos in slow motion to enjoy fast moving scenes in detail, such as falling water droplets or dance moves.

- 1) Tap (a) Camera, swipe right on the screen and choose SLOW-MOTION.
- 2) Tap to start a video recording. Touch the screen to focus on an object or area during recording.

3) Tap **(a)** to end the recording.

**Time-lapse:** Make an accelerated video of a slow-changing scene. For example, you can record the opening of a flower or the movement of clouds.

- 1) Tap **Camera**, swipe right on the screen and choose **TIME-LAPSE.** (You can also use Time-lapse mode for the front camera. Just tap  $\bigcirc$  to switch to the front camera.)
- 2) Tap **(a)** to start a video recording. Touch the screen to focus on an object or area during recording.
- 3) Tap to end the recording.

**HDR:** Use HDR mode to help you get great shots in high-contrast situations.

- 1) Tap Camera, tap in to turn it on.
- 2) Hold your phone steady and then tap 

  to take a photo.

Beauty: Use beauty mode for stunning selfies and younger, smoother-looking skin.

- 1) Tap Camera, tap (a) to turn it on.
- 2) Drag the slider to adjust the beauty level.
- 3) Frame the scene you want to capture, and then tap . The camera will automatically detect each face in the photo and apply the beauty settings.

**Night mode:** Night mode improves the quality of images taken at night and in low-light conditions by accentuating the detail of darker areas to produce brighter, more colorful images.

- 1) When you frame a scene in a low-light condition, © appears automatically on the screen.
- 2) Tap **©** to turn it on. Frame the scene and then tap **©**.

Note:

Panorama mode, slow-motion mode, night mode and HDR mode are not available for the front camera.

### 7. 5 Camera and video settings

Tap Camera, swipe right on the screen and tap to configure the following camera settings.

**Save the location:** Save the location where the photo was taken.

- 1) Turn the swtich on and then take a photo.
- 2) Go to Gallery, select the photo and tap: -> Details -> Location to view the location information.

**Grids:** If Grids is turned on, composition of pictures is more convenient.

Photo size: Set photo size of back camera and front camera.

Video quality: Set video quality of back camera and front camera.

**Time-lapse interval:** Set time-lapse interval, such as 1/2/5/10 seconds.

**Screen off snapshot:** On the locked screen, you can press the Volume down button twice in quick succession to take a photo. Due to the rapid capture time, the image quality may decrease for night-time or close-up shots. Choose a location with ample light and shoot from a suitable distance. The feature is not available during music playback or when your phone has less than 2% battery power remaining. Flash mode is not available when your phone has less than 5% power remaining.

## 7.6 Gallery

#### View photos and videos

You can view the following photos and videos in **Gallery**:

- · Photos and videos shot with the camera.
- Photos and videos that your friends shared with you.
- Photos and videos synced from your computer.

• Photos and videos saved from messages, emails, or websites, as well as screenshots.

View photos in chronological order: On the Home screen, tap **Gallery**, go to the **PHOTOS** tab. Photos and videos are automatically displayed in chronological order.

View photos by album: Go to the **ALBUMS** tab to view photos and videos sort by albums. Photos and videos are automatically added to the default folders, such as Burst, Panorama, Selfie, Video and so on. For example, if you take a selfie, you can go to Selfie album to find your photos.

#### Manage photos and videos

Go to **Gallery**, select a photo or a video and you can:

- Share: Tap <, choose a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions to share your files.
- Edit: Tap 
  to edit the photo. (The feature is only available for photos in JPG/JPEG, BMP or PNG format.) For more information, see Edit an image.
- Save as favorites: Tap  $\bigcirc$  and the photo will be saved in the **Favorites** album.
- Delete: Tap 🔳 to delete the selected files.(You can also tap and hold a photo and tap 🔳 to delete.)

Tap and hold a photo and you can:

- Share: Tap <, choose a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions to share your files.
- Delete: Tap **i** to delete the selected files.
- Save picture as: You can set the selected picture as wallpaper or contact photo and more by tapping : -> Save picture as.
- Details: Tap : -> **Details** to view more information about the selected photo, such as file size, focal length and more.

#### Edit an image

The Gallery application comes with powerful image editing tools that you can use to bring your photos to life. Select an image you want to edit and tap ...

- Tap 👫 and you can add a filter.
- Tap 🔁 and you can:
  - Crop an image: Tap 🗘 and drag the dotted edges to crop the image to the desired size, then tap 🗸
  - Straighten an image: Tag me to make a slight adjustment to the angle of the photo and crop the excess part of the photo to maintain the original aspect ratio.
  - Rotate an image: Tag (5) to adjust the angle of rotation.
  - Add mirror effect: Tag []; to create a mirror image of the photo.
- Tap **=** and you can adjust image parameters to make your image look more vivid.



### Edit a file

  - Move files to a destination folder: Tap 🚜, select a destination folder, and then tap Paste.
  - Delete files: Tap -> YES.
  - Share files: Tap <, choose a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions to share your files.

### Note:

When you touch and hold a folder or file, you can select multiple folders and files at a time.

### 11.3 Share files

Files can be shared and managed on mobile phones and computers connected to the same local area network. Before sharing files, make sure that your computer supports the network neighborhood feature.





### 16.1 SIM cards

### **Dual SIM settings**

When two SIM cards are inserted, only one SIM card can be set as the 4G/3G/2G SIM. The other SIM card slot only supports 2G networks. You can also configure the default card for mobile data, phone calls and SMS messages according to your monthly plan.

- Go to Settings -> SIM cards.
- 2. Choose the preferred SIM for cellular data, calls or SMS messages.



### Note:

1. If you disable a SIM card, you will be unable to use it to make calls, send messages, or access the Internet.

2. You can configure whether you want to select a SIM card manually or use the default SIM card each time you make a call. If you choose to use the default SIMcard, your phone will use that SIM card for all outgoing calls.

### 16.2 Airplane mode

Wireless devices may interfere with an airplane's flight system. Power off your phone or switch to airplane mode when you are on a flight.

After you enable airplane mode, all of your phone's network features will be disabled. You will not be able to make or receive calls, use mobile data, Bluetooth or Wi-Fi. However, you will still be able to play music, watch videos, and use applications that do not require an Internet connection. When airplane mode is on, \( \lambda \) is displayed in the status bar.

Use one of the following methods to enable or disable airplane mode:

- Go to Settings -> More connection settings and then turn the Airplane mode switch on.
- Swipe down from the status bar( except for the Lock screen) twice to open the Quick settings panel, and then tap \*Airplane mode to turn it on.
- Press and hold the Power button, and then tap **Airplane mode**.

### 16.3 Display

Configure the display settings to personalize your phone. For example, you can change the wallpaper, font size, and screen-off time.

- 1. On the Home screen, tap Settings -> Display.
- 2. You can configure the following settings.
  - Brightness level: Your phone will automatically adjust the screen brightness according to the ambient brightness. You can also use the brightness slider to manually adjust the brightness.
  - Adaptive brightness: Tap to enable optimizing brightness level for available light.
  - Color temperature: Adjust the color temperature for images displayed on your phone. Select a warmer color temperature for a softer look and a cooler color temperature for a sharper image. Use the slider to manually adjust the color temperature.
  - Wallpaper: Set the lock screen and Home screen wallpapers. You can also go to **Themes** -> **Themes** -> **Wallpapers** to set the screen papers.
  - LED indicator: If Notification indicator is enabled, the status indicator will blink when you receive notifications. If Charging indicator is enabled, the status indicator will be on when your phone is charging.
  - Font size: Set the font size.
  - Automatically lock: Make the phone lock automatically after a certaint time of inacticity.
  - Auto-rotate screen: If this option is enabled, your screen's orientation will switch automatically depending on how you hold your phone when performing certain operations, such as browsing a web page, viewing a picture, or writing a message.
  - Cast: Share your phone screen with other devices.

### 16. 4 Sounds and vibration

Change the incoming call and message ringtones or set the system alert sound and vibration effects.

- 1. On the Home screen, tap Settings -> Sounds and vibration.
- 2. You can configure the following settings.
  - · Volume: Adjust the ringtone, media and alarm volume.

- Vibrate: If **Also vibrate for calls** is enabled, your phone will vibrate when receiving incoming calls. If **Vibrate on silent** is enabled, your phone will vibrate without sounds.
- Ringtones & notification tones: Select ringtone for SIM1 and SIM2. Choose a preset ringtone as the notification tone for messages, emails and other notifications.
- System: Touch the switches to enable or disable dial pad touch tones, lock sounds, touch sounds and vibrate on touch.

### 16.5 Storage

Check that there is enough space on your phone's internal storage or microSD card before downloading update packages or large files.

Go to Settings -> Storage to view available storage information.

### 16.6 Battery

- 2. Configure the following settings to better use your battery feature. You can tap **Battery saver** to choose a power saving mode for your phone.


### 16.7 Apps

- 1. On the Home screen, tap Settings.
- 2. Tap **Apps** to view all the apps including the installed and running apps.

### 16.8 Float button

The Float button gives you access to a number of frequently-used options and features, such as the back key, home key, and one-touch optimization. You can move the floating button around the screen for easy one-hand use.

- 1. Go to Settings -> Device -> More -> Smart settings -> FloatButton and turn the switch on.
- 2. Once enabled, the Float button will be shown on all screens except the Lock screen and Notification panel. Touch to expand the Float button menu.



- 3. From the menu, you can:
  - Tap to return to the previous screen.
  - Tap (a) to return to the Home screen.
  - Tap **(a)** to display the list of recently used applications.
  - Tap 😝 to take a screenshot.
  - Tap (a) to lock the screen.

• Tap 🔯 to collapse the menu.

### 16.9 Location

Enable location-based services to ensure that map, navigation, and weather applications can access your location information.

- Go to Settings -> Location.
- 2. Tap the switch to enable the location services.
- 3. Tap **Mode** to select the location mode.
  - High accuracy: Use GPS, WLAN, Bluetooth, or cellular networks to determine location. Enable this option for highly accurate positioning.
  - Battery saving: Use WLAN, Bluetooth, or cellular networks to determine location. Enable this option for reduced power consumption and longer standby times.
  - Device only: Use GPS to determine location. Enable this option to reduce mobile data usage.

### 16. 10 Accounts

When you use your phone for the first time, you can set up a connection with your existing account or create a new account.

#### Add an account

- Go to settings -> Accounts.
- 2. Tap **Add account**.
- 3. Select an account type, and then follow the onscreen instructions to enter your account information.

### Delete an account

- 1. Go to settings -> Accounts and then select the account type.
- 2. Select the account that you want to delete, and then tap : -> Remove account to delete it.

### Synchronize accounts

Enable the sync feature to keep all of your phone's data up-to-date and prevent data loss. You can sync emails, contacts, and other data from your old phone or computer. The type of data that can be synced depends on the account type. Some applications may not support syncing for all data types.

The example below illustrates how to sync data for an email account.

- 2. Tap : and check the **Auto-sync data** box turn it on.
- 3. Select an account type, and then select the account you want to sync with your phone. Then it will automatically sync data.

### 16. 11 Language and input

Manage your phone's language and input settings.

### Change the system language

- 1. Go to **☼ Settings** -> **Language & input**.
- 2. Tap **Language** and select the desired language from the list.

### 16. 12 Backup and reset

Backups help ensure that you never lose your data. You can back up app data, WLAN passwords and other settings to Google servers.

### Back up your data

- Go to Settings -> Backup & reset -> Backup and restore -> Back up my data.
- 2. Tap **Back up my data**, turn the switch on.
- 3. Go back to the previous page and you can back up account or turn the **Automatic restore** switch to make your phone restore backed up settings and data when reinstalling an app.

### **Restore factory settings**

Restore your phone to its factory settings if it crashes or is slow to respond.

Back up important data on your phone before restoring factory settings. For more information, see Using the Backup application to back up and restore data. Restoring factory settings will erase all personal data from your phone's internal storage, including your Google account, system and app data and settings, download apps, music, photos and other user data.

- Go to ♥Settings -> Backup & reset -> Factory data reset.
- 2. Tap **RESET PHONE** to restore your phone to factory settings. Your phone will restart automatically when the process is complete.

### 16. 13 System updates

Update your phone's system to the latest version to enhance performance.

- 1. Go to Settings -> System updates. You can see your phone's version number on this interface.
- 2. Tap Check for update.

### Note:

- 1. Using unauthorized third-party software to update your phone may render your phone unusable or put your personal information at risk. Always update through your phone's online update feature or send your phone to a nearby authorized Neffos service center for assistance.
- 2. Your personal data will not be erased during a system update unless you have installed an incompatible app. It is better to back up important data before updating your phone.
- 3. When updating, ensure that your phone has at least 30% battery power remaining.
- 4. After updating, you may find that some third-party applications are incompatible with your system, such as Internet banking applications and games. This is because it takes a while for third-party application developers to release updates for new Android releases. Please wait until a new version of the application is released.
- 5. You can also check your phone's version number in Settings -> About phone -> Build number.

### 16. 14 Date and time

- 1. Go to **☼ Settings** -> **Date & time** to configure the settings.
- 2. You can set the following options:
  - Automatic date & time: Choose to use network-provided time or GPS-provided time.
  - Automatic time zone: Turn the switch on to use the network-provided time zone.
  - Use 24-hour format: Turn the switch on to use 24-hour format.
  - Week starts on: Choose the day a week starts on.

### 16. 15 Accessibility

Accessibility features make it easier for users with impaired vision or hearing to use their phone.

### **TalkBack**

TalkBack is an accessibility feature designed for visually impaired users. It provides audible prompts to help you operate your phone. Once it is enabled, your phone will issue audible prompts for all content that you touch, select, or enable. Please enable with caution.

- Enable or disable TalkBack
  - 1) Go to Settings -> More -> Smart settings -> Accessibility.
  - 2) Tap **TalkBack** and turn the switch on, and then tap **OK** to enable TalkBack. The audible tutorial will be started automatically when you enable TalkBack for the first time. If you need to play the tutorial again, touch **SETTINGS**, and then select **Launch TalkBack tutorial**.
  - 3) Tap **SETTINGS**, and then turn **Explore by touch** on. Your phone will not issue audible prompts for the content that you touch unless you turn on **Explore by touch**.
  - 4) Disable TalkBack by tapping the switch until the green outline is around it, then double-tapping it. Do the same interaction for the resulting confirmation dialog.
- Use TalkBack to control your phone

After you have enabled TalkBack, use gestures to:

- 1) Browse the screen: Use two fingers to swipe the screen (instead of one). Swipe up or down with two fingers to scroll through menu lists. Swipe left or right to move between screens.
- 2) Select an item: Touch an item with one finger to select it (it will not open). The phone will read out the content of the selected item.
- 3) Open an item: Double touch any part of the screen using one finger to confirm your selection from the previous step. For example, if you want to open **Weather**, two steps are required: Tap the Weather icon once using one finger, and then touch twice on any part of the screen.
- Configure the TalkBack settings

TalkBack settings can be customized to suit your individual needs.

- 1) On the TalkBack screen, tap **SETTINGS** on the top right corner of the screen.
- 2) You can adjust the speech volume, text-to-speech settings, control gestures, and more.
- Captions

TalkBack displays captions for hearing-impaired users.

- 1) Go to Settings -> More -> Smart settings -> Accessibility -> Captions.
- 2) Tap Captions and turn the switch on, and then configure the language, text size and caption style.

### **Magnification gestures**

Use magnification gestures to zoom in on a specific area. (The keyboard and the navigation bar cannot be magnified.)

- 1. Go to Settings -> More -> Smart settings -> Accessibility.
- 2. Tap **Magnification gestures** and turn the switch on.
  - Zoom in: Touch the screen three times in quick succession to zoom in. Touch the screen three times again to zoom back out. Magnification gestures will still be enabled when you touch the screen three times. Turn off the Magnification gestures switch to disable magnification gestures. While zoom in, you can:
    - 1) Browse a magnified area: Swipe the screen using two or more fingers.
    - 2 ) Adjust the zoom level: Pinch two or more fingers together or spread them apart. To zoom in, spread your fingers apart. Pinch your fingers together to zoom back out.

• Zoom in temporarily: Touch the screen three times in quick succession and hold your finger on the screen. Keep your finger on the screen and swipe to browse a magnified area. Release your finger to zoom back out.

### Use the Power button to end a call

- Go to Settings -> More -> Smart settings -> Accessibility.
- 2. Turn on the **Power button ends a call** switch. Once you have enabled this feature, press the Power button to end a call.

### Adjusting the screen response time

- Go to ♥ Settings -> More -> Smart settings -> Accessibility.
- 2. Tap **Touch & hold delay** and then select the desired delay time: Short/Medium/Long.

### **Color correction**

Color correction mode adjusts colors to make it easier for color vision impaired users to distinguish between different parts of the screen.

Note:

Enable this mode with caution, as it may affect your phone's battery.

- 1. Go to Settings -> More -> Smart settings -> Accessibility.
- 2. Tap **Color correction** and then turn on the switch.
- 3. Tap **Correction mode** and select a correction mode.

### 16. 16 About phone

View your phone's specifications in a few simple steps. You can view information about your phone's status, model, baseband version and so on.

Go to Settings -> About phone. Swipe up or down on the screen to view information about the IMEI information, SIM status, model number, build number and more.
