## Unpack



## Install the SIM or USIM card and battery


When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

- If the device is on, press and hold the Power key and select **Power off**  $\rightarrow$  **OK** to turn it off.
- 2 Remove the back cover.





- Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.
- Do not bend or twist the back cover excessively.
   Doing so may damage the cover.
- 3 Insert the SIM or USIM card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.






- Do not insert a memory card into the SIM card slot.
- The SIM card slot of your device is only suited for standard SIM cards. Inserting a microSIM card or a microSIM card with an unauthorised holder may cause damage to the SIM card slot of your device.

## Charge the battery

Before using the device for the first time or when the battery has been unused for an extended period, you must charge the battery.

You can charge the device with a travel adapter or by connecting the device to a PC with a USB cable.




Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorised chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.



- When your battery is low, the device will emit a
  warning tone and display a low battery message. The
  battery icon will also be empty. If the battery level
  becomes too low, the device will automatically power
  off. Recharge your battery to continue using your
  device.
- If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even with the travel adapter connected. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

#### Charge with a travel adapter

Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Connecting the travel adapter improperly may cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

2 Plug the large end of the travel adapter into an electrical socket.



- You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While the device is charging, the touch screen may not function due to an unstable power supply. If this happens, unplug the travel adapter from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
- If your device is not charging properly, bring your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- 3 When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), first unplug the travel adapter from the device and then from the power outlet.
- Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing this may cause damage to the device.
- To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the travel adapter from the electrical socket when not in use to avoid wasting power. The device should remain close to the electrical socket while charging.

#### > Charge with a USB cable

Before charging, ensure that your PC is turned on.

- Plug one end (micro-USB) of the USB cable into the multifunction jack.
- Plug the other end of the USB cable into a USB port on a PC.



Depending on the type of USB cable you are using, it may take some time before charging begins.

3 When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), first unplug the USB cable from the device and then from the PC.

## Insert a memory card


Your device accepts memory cards with maximum capacities of 32 GB. Depending on the memory card manufacturer and type, some memory cards may not be compatible with your device.



Samsung uses approved industry standards for memory cards, but some brands may not be fully compatible with your device. Using an incompatible memory card may damage your device or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.



- Your device supports only the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your device will ask you to reformat the memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- When you insert a memory card in your device, the file directory of the memory card will appear in the external\_sd folder under the internal memory.
- Remove the back cover.
- 2 Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.



- 3 Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4 Replace the back cover.

#### > Remove the memory card

Before removing a memory card, first unmount it for safe removal.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Storage
   → Unmount SD card → OK.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- 3 Push the memory card gently until it disengages from the device.
- 4 Remove the memory card.
- 5 Replace the back cover.
- Do not remove a memory card while the device is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data or damage to the memory card or device.

#### > Format the memory card

Formatting your memory card on a PC may cause incompatibilities with your device. Format the memory card only on the device.

In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Storage**  $\rightarrow$  **Format SD** card  $\rightarrow$  **Format SD** card  $\rightarrow$  **Erase everything**.





#### Use the touch screen

Your device's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



- Do not press the touch screen with your fingertips, or use sharp tools on the touch screen. Doing so may damage the touch screen or cause it to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.
- Leaving the touch screen idle for extended periods may result in afterimages (screen burn-in) or ghosting.
   Turn off the touch screen when you do not use the device.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.

Control your touch screen with the following actions:

- Tap: Touch once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists.
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or web pages.



- Your device turns off the touch screen when you do not use the device for a specified period. To turn on the screen, press the Power Key or the Home key.
- You can also adjust the backlight time. In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings → Display → Screen timeout.

## Lock or unlock the touch screen and keys

You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted device operations.

To lock, press the Power Key. To unlock, turn on the screen by pressing the Power Key or the Home key, tap anywhere on the screen, and then drag your finger outside of the large circle.



You can activate the screen lock feature to prevent others from using or accessing your personal data and information saved in your device. ▶ p. 32

#### Get to know the idle screen

When the device is in Idle mode, you will see the idle screen. From the idle screen, you can view indicator icons, widgets, shortcuts to applications, and other items.

The idle screen has multiple panels. Scroll left or right to a panel of the idle screen. You can also select a dot at the bottom of the screen to move directly to the corresponding screen.

#### Add items to the idle screen

You can customise the idle screen by adding shortcuts to applications or items in applications, widgets, or folders. To add items to the idle screen.

- Press  $[=] \rightarrow Add$  or tap and hold the empty area on the idle screen.
- 2 Select the item category  $\rightarrow$  an item:
  - Widgets: Add widgets to the idle screen.
  - **Shortcuts**: Add shortcuts to items, such as applications, bookmarks, and contacts.

- Folders: Create a new folder or add folders for your contacts.
- Wallpapers: Set a background image.

#### Move items on the idle screen

- Tap and hold an item to move.
- 2 Drag the item to the location you want.

#### > Remove items from the idle screen

- Tap and hold an item to remove.
  The trash bin appears at the bottom of the idle screen.
- 2 Drag the item to the trash bin.
- 3 When the item turns red, release the item.

#### Use the notifications panel

In Idle mode or while using an application, tap the indicator icons area and drag your finger down to open the notifications panel. You can activate or deactivate wireless connection features and access a list of notifications, such as messages, calls, events or processing status. To hide the panel, drag the bottom of the list up.

From the notifications panel, you can use the following options:

- Wi-Fi: Activate or deactivate the Wi-Fi feature. ▶ p. 98
- **Bluetooth**: Activate or deactivate the Bluetooth wireless connection feature. ▶ p. 95
- **GPS**: Activate or deactivate the GPS feature.

- **Sound**: Activate or deactivate Silent/Vibration mode.
- **Screen rotation**: Activate or deactivate the auto rotation.



Available options may vary depending on your region or service provider.

#### Add or remove panels to the idle screen

You can add or remove panels of the idle screen to organise widgets according to your preferences and needs.

- In Idle mode, press [□] → Edit.
   You can also place your two fingers on the screen and pinch to switch to Edit mode.
- 2 Add or remove panels by using the following features:
  - To remove a panel, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to the trash bin at the bottom of the screen.
  - To add a new panel, select .
  - To change the order of the panels, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to the location you want.
- 3 When you are finished, press [≤].

## **Access applications**

To access your device's applications,

- In Idle mode, select **Applications** to access the application list.
- 2 Scroll left or right to another screen.
  You can also select a dot at the bottom of the screen to move directly to the corresponding screen.
- 3 Select an application.



- When you use applications provided by Google, you must have a Google account. If you do not have a Google account, sign up for a Google account.
- You can add a shortcut to an application by tapping and holding the application icon from the application list. You can move the icon to the location you want on the idle screen.
- 4 Press [➡] to return to the previous screen; Press the Home key to return to the idle screen.



- If you rotate the device while using some features, the interface will automatically rotate as well. To prevent the interface from rotating, open the notifications panel and select **Screen rotation**.
- While using the device, you can capture an image of a screen by pressing and holding the Home key and the Power key simultaneously. The image will be saved in My files 

  Pictures 

  Screenshots.

#### Organise applications

You can reorganise the applications in the application list by changing their order or grouping them into categories to suit your preferences and needs.

- In the application list, press  $[\blacksquare] \rightarrow \text{Edit} \rightarrow \text{OK}$ .
- 2 Tap and hold an application.
- 3 Drag the application icon to the location you want. You can move an application icon to another screen. You can also move most-used applications next to Home.
- 4 Press [□] → Save.

To add a folder or panel to the screen,

- In the application list, press  $[=] \rightarrow Edit$ .
- 2 Tap and hold an application.
- 3 Drag the application icon to Add Folder or Add Page at the bottom of the screen.
- 4 Repeat steps 2-3 to add more applications.
- 5 Drag Add Folder or Add Page to the screen. A new folder or panel containing the applications is added to the screen.
- 6 If you added a folder, enter a name and select **OK**.
- 7 Press  $[\blacksquare] \rightarrow Save$ .

To change the order of the main screens,

- In the application list, place your two fingers on the screen and pinch.

#### Adjust the brightness of the display

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Display → Brightness.
- 2 Clear the check box next to **Automatic brightness**.

The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the device consumes battery power.

#### > Set a screen lock

#### **Enter text**

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad or by inputting handwriting on the screen.


#### Change the keyboard type

You can change the keyboard type. Open the notifications panel and select **Select input method**  $\rightarrow$  a keyboard type (Android keyboard, Samsung keyboard, or Swype).

You can also enter text with your voice. Select **Google voice typing**, and then select a language to use for the voice input feature.



# **Download applications from Play Store**

Based on the Android platform, your device's functionality can be extended by installing additional applications. Play Store provides you an easy and quick way to shop for games and mobile applications.

  - Your device will save user files from downloaded applications to the internal memory.

# Install an application

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Play Store**.
- 2 Select Continue → Accept when the terms and conditions appear.
- 3 Search for a file or application and download it.

# Uninstall an application

- I From the Play Store home screen, press [ $\blacksquare$ ] → **My Apps**.
- 2 Select the item you want to delete.
- 3 Select **Uninstall**  $\rightarrow$  **OK**.

#### Download files from the web

When you download files or web applications from the web, your device saves them in a memory card.



Files you download from the web can include viruses that will damage your device. To lessen your risk, only download files from sources you trust.



Some media files include Digital Rights Management to protect copyrights. This protection may prevent you from downloading, copying, modifying, or transferring some files.

To download files from the web,

- I In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Internet**.
- 2 Search for a file or application and download it.

To install applications downloaded from websites other than Play Store, you must select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Security**  $\rightarrow$  **Unknown sources**  $\rightarrow$  **OK**.

# Synchronise data

You can synchronise data with various web servers and back up or restore your data.

Once the synchronisation is completed, your device stays connected to the web. If any change is made on the web, the updated information will appear on your device and will automatically begin synchronisation, and vice versa.



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

# > Set up a server account

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Accounts and sync.
- 2 Select **Add account**  $\rightarrow$  an account type.
- 3 Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the account setup.

For online community services, such as Facebook or MySpace, enter your user name and password and select **Log in**.

# Activate automatic sync

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Accounts and sync.
- 2 Select an account.
- 3 Select the applications you want to synchronise.

To exclude applications from automatic synchronisation, clear the check boxes next to the applications you want.

# Synchronise data manually

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings

- 3 Select **Sync now**. Your device will start synchronising the data you set for synchronisation.

# Communication

# **Calling**

Learn to use calling functions, such as making and answering calls, using options available during a call or customising and using call-related features.

#### Make or answer a call

You can use the buttons or the touch screen when you make, accept, end or reject calls.



- When you turn on the proximity sensor, your device automatically turns off and locks the touch screen to prevent accidental inputs when you hold the device near your face. ► p. 126
- Static electricity discharged from your body or clothing may interfere with the proximity sensor during a call.

#### Make a call

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Phone** → **Keypad**, and enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2 Select to make a voice call.
- 3 To end the call, select End call.



- Use the phonebook to save numbers you dial frequently. ➤ p. 76
- To quickly access the call log to redial the numbers you dialled recently, select **Phone** → **Logs**.

#### Answer a call

When a call comes in, drag \(\mathbb{C}\) right.



When the device is ringing, press the Volume key to mute the ringtone.

2 To end the call, select **End call**.

#### Reject a call

When a call comes in, drag 6 left.

To send a message when you reject incoming calls, select Reject call with message.



First set a text message to be sent to callers. In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$ Call → Set reject messages.

#### Call an international number

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Phone**  $\rightarrow$  **Keypad**, and tap and hold **0** to insert the + character.
- 2 Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code and phone number), and then select to dial the number

#### Use a headset

By plugging a headset into the device, you can answer and control calls hands-free

- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To reject a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To place a call on hold or retrieve a held call during a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

# > Use options during a call

You can use the following options while a call is in progress:

- To adjust the voice volume, press the Volume key up or down.
- To place a call on hold, select III. To retrieve a held call, select .
- To dial a second call, select **Add call** and then dial a new number.
- To answer a second call, drag right when a call waiting tone sounds. The device asks whether to end or hold the first call. You must subscribe to the call waiting service to use this feature.
- To open the dialling screen, select **Keypad**.
- To activate the speakerphone feature, select **Speaker**.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

- To turn off the microphone so that the other party cannot hear you, select **Mute**.
- To listen and talk to the other party via a Bluetooth headset, select **Headset**.
- To open the phonebook, press [□] → Contacts.
- To add a memo, press  $[\blacksquare] \rightarrow Memo$ .
- To switch between the two calls, select **Swap**.
- To make a multiparty call (conference call), make or answer a second call and select **Merge** when connected to the second party. Repeat to add more parties. You must subscribe to the multiparty call service to use this feature.

#### View and dial missed calls

Your device will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call, open the notifications panel and select the missed call.

#### Use additional features

You can use various other call-related features, such as auto rejection, Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode, or call diverting or barring.

#### Set auto rejection

Use auto rejection to reject calls from certain numbers automatically. To activate auto rejection and create auto reject lists,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Call → Call rejection.
- 2 Select **Auto reject mode**  $\rightarrow$  an option.

Option	Function
All numbers	Reject all calls.
Auto reject numbers	Reject calls from phone numbers on the auto reject list.

- 3 Select **Auto reject list**.
- 4 Select **Add** and enter a phone number.
- 5 Select **Match criteria**  $\rightarrow$  an option (if necessary).
- 6 Select **Save**.
- To add more numbers, repeat steps 4-6.

#### **Use Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode**

In FDN mode, your device will restrict outgoing calls, except for the numbers stored in the FDN list. To activate FDN mode,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
   → Call → Additional settings → Fixed Dialling
   Numbers → Enable FDN.
- 2 Enter the PIN2 supplied with your SIM or USIM card and select **OK**.
- 3 Select **FDN list** and add contacts to be used in FDN mode.

#### **Set call forwarding**

Call diverting is a network feature to send incoming calls to another number that you specify. You can set this feature separately for several conditions when you are not able to answer calls, such as when you are already on the phone or when you are outside of the service area.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Call**  $\rightarrow$  **Call forwarding**  $\rightarrow$  **Voice call**.
- 2 Select a condition.
- 3 Enter a number to which calls will be forwarded and select **Enable**.

Your setting will be sent to the network.

#### Set call barring

Call barring is a network feature to restrict certain types of calling or to prevent others from making calls with your device.

In Idle mode, open the application list and select Settings
 → Call → Additional settings → Call barring → Voice call.

- 2 Select a call barring option.
- 3 Enter a call barring password and select OK. Your setting will be sent to the network.

#### **Set call waiting**


Call waiting is a network feature to alert you of an incoming call while you are on a previous call.

In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Call**  $\rightarrow$  **Additional settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Call waiting**. Your setting will be sent to the network.

# > View call logs

You can view logs of your calls filtered by their types.

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Phone** → **Logs**.
- 2 Press  $[=] \rightarrow$  View by  $\rightarrow$  an option to sort the call logs.



3 Select a log to view its details.



From the detail view, you can dial the number, send a message to the number or add the number to the phonebook or auto reject list.

# Messaging

Learn to create and send text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) messages, and view or manage messages you have sent or received.



You may incur additional charges for sending or receiving messages while outside your home service area. For details, contact your service provider.

# > Send a text message

- 3 Add recipients of your message.
  - Enter phone numbers manually and separate them with a semicolon or a comma.
  - Select phone numbers from the lists by selecting **2**.
- 4 Select **Tap to enter message** and enter your message text.
  - To insert emoticons, press  $[\blacksquare] \rightarrow$ **Insert smiley**.
- 5 Select **Send** to send the message.

# > Send a multimedia message

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select Messaging.
- Select

  - Enter phone numbers or email addresses manually and separate them with a semicolon or a comma.
  - Select phone numbers or email addresses from the lists by selecting



When you enter an email address, the device will convert the message as a multimedia message.

  You can select a file from the file list or create a new photo, video, or sound.

# View a text or multimedia message

  - Your messages are grouped into message threads by contact, like a messenger.

# > Listen to voice mail messages

If you have set missed calls to be diverted to the voice mail server, callers may leave voice messages when you do not answer incoming calls. To access your voice mail inbox and listen to voice mail messages,



- Select **Accept** to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the device.

Received data is saved to the bluetooth folder. If you receive a contact, it is automatically saved to the phonebook.

#### Wi-Fi

Learn to use your device's wireless networking capabilities to activate and connect to any wireless local area network (WLAN) compatible with the IEEE 802.11 b/g/n standards. You can connect to the internet or other network devices anywhere an access point or wireless hotspot is available.



Your device uses a non-harmonised frequency and is intended for use in all European countries. The WLAN can be operated in the EU without restriction indoors, but cannot be operated outdoors.

#### Activate the Wi-Fi feature

In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**, and then select **OFF** next to **Wi-Fi**.



The Wi-Fi feature running in the background will consume battery power. To preserve battery power, activate the feature only when needed.

#### Find and connect to a Wi-Fi AP

In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings** → **Wi-Fi**.

The device will automatically search for available Wi-Fi APs.

- 2 Select a network.
- 3 Enter a password for the network (if necessary).
- 4 Select Connect.

# > Add a Wi-Fi AP manually

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**→ Wi-Fi → Add network.
- 2 Enter the SSID for the network and select the security type.
- 3 Set the security settings depending on the selected security type.
- 4 Select **Save**.

# Connect to a Wi-Fi AP using a Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS)

Using WPS, you can connect to a secured network.

To connect to a Wi-Fi AP with a WPS button,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings** → **Wi-Fi**.
- 2 Select a network indicated as protected network available, and select the check box next to **Show advanced** options.
- *3* Select the **WPS** drop-down menu.
- 4 Select **Push button**  $\rightarrow$  **Connect**.

To connect to Wi-Fi with a WPS PIN,

- In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**→ Wi-Fi.
- 2 Select a network indicated as protected network available, and select the check box next to **Show advanced** options.
- 3 Select the **WPS** drop-down menu.
- 4 Select PIN from access point or PIN from this device → Connect.
- 5 On the access point, press the WPS button or enter the PIN of your device.

# > Set the static IP settings

- 2 Select a network, and select the check box next to Show advanced options.

  When the owner of the other device accepts the connection, the devices are connected.

2 Select an option for sending data via Wi-Fi.



The method for selecting an option may vary by data type.

3 Search for and select another device.

#### Receive data via Wi-Fi

When you receive data, it is saved to your device automatically. Received data is saved to the ShareViaWifi folder.

#### **AllShare**

Learn to use the Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) service that enables you to share media files between DLNA-enabled devices in your home over Wi-Fi.



- The supported file formats may vary depending on the software of the device.
- Some files may not play on the DLNA-enabled devices depending on the devices.

# Customise DLNA settings for sharing media files

To allow other DLNA-enabled devices to access media files on your device, you must activate media sharing.

# Mobile network sharing

Learn to set your device as a wireless modem or wireless access point for PCs or other devices, and share your device's mobile network connection.

# > Share your device's mobile network via Wi-Fi

   → More... → Tethering and portable hotspot.
- 2 Select Portable Wi-Fi hotspot → OK to activate the Wi-Fi tethering feature.

### **PC** connections

Learn to connect your device to a PC with a USB cable in USB connection modes. By connecting the device to a PC, you can transfer data to and from your device directly and use the Samsung Kies program.



Do not disconnect the USB cable from a computer while the device is transferring or accessing data. Doing so may result in data loss or damage to the device.



For best results, connect the USB cable directly to a USB port on a computer. Data transfers may fail when using a USB hub.

## Connect with Samsung Kies

Ensure that Samsung Kies is installed on your PC. You can download the program from the Samsung website.

## Connect as a mass storage device

The file directory of the memory card will appear as a removable disk, separate from the internal memory.



## My files

Learn to quickly and easily access all of your images, videos, music, sound clips, and other types of files stored in your device and memory card.

  - To move up one level in the file directory, select **Up**.
  - To return to the Home directory, select **Home**.
- 3 Select a file to open.

#### **NFC**

The battery contains a built-in NFC antenna. Handle the battery carefully to avoid damaging the NFC antenna.

- Fixed Dialling Numbers: Activate or deactivate FDN mode to restrict calls to numbers in the FDN list. You must enter the PIN2 supplied with your SIM or USIM card and reboot the device.
- **Voicemail service**: Select your service provider or set another provider to receive voice mails.
- Voicemail: Enter the number to access the voice mail service. You can obtain this number from your service provider.

#### Sound

Change the settings for various sounds on your device.

- **Volumes**: Adjust the volume level for call ringtones, media sound, device system sound, and notification ringtones.
- Vibration intensity: Adjust the vibration intensity.
- **Silent mode**: Activate Silent mode to make your device vibrate or mute all sounds, except for media sounds and alarm ringtones.
- **Phone ringtone**: Select a ringtone to alert you to incoming calls.
- **Default notification**: Select a ringtone to alert you to events, such as incoming messages and missed calls.
- **Sound and vibration**: Set the device to vibrate and play a ringtone for incoming calls.
- **Dial pad touch tones**: Set the device to sound when you touch the keys on the dialling screen.



- **Touch sounds**: Set the device to sound when you select an application or option on the touch screen.
- **Screen lock sound**: Set the device to sound when you lock or unlock the touch screen.
- Vibrate on touch: Set the device to vibrate when you press
  [□] or [□], or press and hold the Home key or the Power
  key.

## **Display**

Change the settings for the display.

- **Home screen wallpaper**: Select a background image for the idle screen.
- Lock screen wallpaper: Select an image to display when the screen is locked.
- **Clock**: Set to show the clock on the locked screen.
- **Weather**: Set to show the weather information on the locked screen.
- Weather settings: Customise the settings for the weather information.
- **Clock and weather position**: Select the location of the clock and the weather information on the locked screen.
- Help text: Set to show the help text on the locked screen.
- **Brightness**: Set the brightness of the display.
- **Screen mode**: Select a display mode.
- **Auto-rotate screen**: Set whether or not to rotate the content automatically when the device is rotated.
- **Screen timeout**: Set the length of time the device waits before turning off the display's backlight.
- Font style: Change the font type for the display text. You can download fonts from Play Store by selecting Get fonts online.



- Display battery percentage: Set to view the remaining battery life.
- Touch key light duration: Set the duration for the touch key backlight.
- Auto adjust screen power: Set to save power by adjusting the brightness of the display.
- Horizontal calibration: Calibrate the accelerometer to adjust the horizontal axis of the device for better motion recognition.
- Gyroscope calibration: Calibrate the gyroscope so your device can correctly recognise rotation.



- Place the device on a stable surface during calibration. The calibration process may fail if the device vibrates or moves during calibration.
  - Calibrate the gyroscope when tilting or panning motions, or motion-enabled games, show drifting or unintended movements.

## Power saving

- **System power saving mode**: Activate Power saving mode to limit some system resource usage.
- Custom power saving mode: Set to activate Power saving mode according to your custom settings.
- Custom power saving mode settings:
  - **Power saving starts at**: Select a power level for Power saving mode.
  - Turn off Wi-Fi: Deactivate the Wi-Fi feature when the device is not connected with a Wi-Fi AP.



- Turn off Bluetooth: Deactivate the Bluetooth feature when not in use.
- Turn off GPS: Deactivate the GPS feature when not in use.
- Turn off Sync: Turn off sync when the device is not synchronising with a web server.
- **Brightness**: Activate the brightness setting for Power saving mode.
- **Brightness**: Set the brightness level for Power saving mode.
- **Screen timeout**: Set the length of time the device waits before turning off the display's backlight.
- **Learn about power saving**: Learn how to reduce battery consumption.

## Storage

View memory information for your device and memory card. You can also format the USB storage and the memory card.



Formatting a memory card will permanently delete all data from the memory card.



The actual available capacity of the internal memory is less than the specified capacity because the operating system and default applications occupy part of the memory.

## **Battery**

View the amount of power consumed by your device.

## **Applications**

View and manage the applications on your device.



## **Accounts and sync**

Change the settings for the auto sync feature or manage accounts for synchronisation.

#### **Location services**

Change the settings for GPS functionality.

- Google's location service: Set to use Wi-Fi and/or mobile networks for finding your location.
- GPS satellites: Set to use the GPS satellite for finding your location.
- Use sensor aiding: Set to use sensors to enhance pedestrian positioning when the GPS signal is obstructed. There may be variations between the sensor estimates and your actual location.
- Location and Google search: Set the device to use your current location for Google search and other Google services.

## **Security**

Change the settings for securing your device and the SIM or USIM card.

- Screen lock: Set how to unlock the screen.
  - None: Disable the screen lock.
  - **Swipe**: Set to use the screen lock without a PIN, password, pattern, or face detection.
  - Face unlock: Set a face detection lock.
  - Pattern: Set an unlock pattern to unlock the screen.
  - PIN: Set a PIN (numeric) to unlock the screen.
  - Password: Set a password (alphanumeric) to unlock the screen.



- **Encrypt device**: Set a password to encrypt the device to protect data and information saved on the device. Once the device is encrypted, you must enter the password each time you turn on the device. You must first charge the battery because it may take more than an hour to encrypt your device.
- Encrypt SD card:
  - **Encrypt SD card**: Protect your personal information by encrypting the data on your memory card.
  - **Full encryption**: Set to encrypt all files on your memory card.
  - Exclude multimedia files: Set to encrypt all files except multimedia files on your memory card.
- You may not access the encrypted memory card after he factory data reset. First, decode the memory card before the factory data reset.
- SIM Change Alert: Activate or deactivate the Find my mobile feature which helps you locate your device when it is lost or stolen. ► p. 34
- Alert message recipients: Add or edit recipients for the alert message.
- **Remote controls**: Set to control a lost device remotely via the web. This feature will be activated automatically when you sign in to both Samsung and Google accounts.
- **SamsungDive web page**: Access the SamsungDive website to register your Samsung account.
- Set up SIM card lock:
  - Lock SIM card: Activate or deactivate the PIN lock feature to require the PIN before using the device.
  - Change SIM PIN: Change the PIN used to access SIM or USIM data.

- Make passwords visible: Set the device to display your password as you enter.
- **Device administrators**: View device administrators installed on your device. You can activate device administrators to apply new policies to your device.
- **Unknown sources**: Set the device to install applications downloaded from any source. If you do not select this option, you can install only applications downloaded from Play Store.
- **Trusted credentials**: Select certificates and credentials to ensure secure use of various applications.
- **Install from storage**: Install encrypted certificates that are stored in the USB storage.
- **Clear credentials**: Erase the credential contents from the device and reset the password.

## Language and input

Change the settings for text input.

#### Language

Select a display language for all menus and applications.

#### Default

Select a default keyboard type for text input.

#### > Android keyboard

To change the Android keyboard settings, select 4.

- Input language: Select languages for text input.
- **Auto-capitalisation**: Set the device to automatically capitalise the first letter after a final punctuation mark, such as a full stop, question mark, or exclamation mark.



- Vibrate on key-press: Set the device to vibrate when you touch a key.
- **Sound on key-press**: Set the device to sound when you touch a key.
- Pop-up on key press: Set the device to display a large image of each letter you tap.
- **Show settings key**: Set to show the setting key.
- Voice input key: Select how to access voice input.
- Add-on dictionaries: Select and install a dictionary on your device
- Auto-correction: Set the device to automatically correct the misspelled words.
- Advanced settings: Activate advanced features for the Android keyboard.

## Google voice typing

Activate the Google voice input feature to enter text by voice. To change the voice input settings, select =:

- **Select input languages**: Select input languages for Google voice recognition.
- **Block offensive words**: Set to prevent the device from recognising offensive words in voice inputs.



## Samsung keyboard

To change the Samsung keyboard settings, select 4.

- Portrait keypad types: Select the default input method, such as the QWERTY keyboard, traditional keypad, or handwriting screen.
- Input language: Select languages for text input.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages.

- XT9: Activate XT9 mode to predict words based on your input and show word suggestions.
- XT9 advanced settings: Activate the advanced features of XT9 mode, such as auto completion, auto correction, or auto substitution, and set up your own word list.
- **Keypad sweeping**: Enable or disable the keypad sweeping feature for the text input mode. You can switch between input modes by scrolling left or right on the keypad.

- **Audio feedback**: Set to alert you when there are no alternative words for your input if you double-tap a word.
- **Vibrate on keypress**: Set the device to vibrate when you touch a key.
- **Show tips**: Set the device to automatically display tips for your actions when available.
- **Auto-spacing**: Set the device to automatically insert a space between words.
- Auto-capitalisation: Set the device to automatically capitalise the first letter after a final punctuation mark, such as a full stop, question mark, or exclamation mark.
- Show complete trace: Set to display the trace of your dragging on the keyboard.
- Word suggestion: Set the device to predict words according to your input and display word suggestions.

- **Reset Swype's dictionary**: Delete the words you have added to the dictionary.
- **Version**: View version information.

Select a voice recognition engine.

#### Voice Search

For the Google voice recognition, use the following options:

- Language: Select a language for the voice recognition.
- **SafeSearch**: Set the device to filter explicit text and/or images from voice search results.
- **Block offensive words**: Hide offensive words your device recognised from voice search results.

For the Samsung voice recognition, use the following options:

- Language: Select a language for the voice recognition.
- Web search engine: Select a web search engine.
- **Auto-dial**: Set to automatically dial a number when the voice recognition result is confident.
- **Use location**: Set to use your location information for voice search results.
- **Hide offensive words**: Hide offensive words your device recognised from voice search results.
- **Auto-punctuation**: Set to automatically insert punctuation marks when needed.
- **Listen over Bluetooth**: Set to recognise your voice commands when using a connected Bluetooth headset.
- **Voice talk unique ID**: View your device's unique ID for services when you have problems with Voice talk.
- **About**: View version information.
- **Auto-start listening**: Set to automatically begin voice recognition when you launch the voice command feature.
- **Voice command help**: Access help information for using the voice command feature.

- **Social settings**: Change the settings for accessing community websites.
- **Voice talk settings**: Change the settings for using Voice talk.
- **Voice talk help**: Access help information for using Voice talk.

#### > Text-to-speech output

- **Preferred engine**: View and select the text-to-speech engines in your device.
- **Speech rate**: Select a speed for the text-to-speech feature.
- **Listen to an example**: Listen to the spoken text for an example.
- **Driving mode**: Activate Driving mode to set the device to read contents aloud.
- **Driving mode settings**: Specify applications to use in Driving mode.

## > Pointer speed

Adjust the pointer speed for the mouse or trackpad connected to your device.

## Back up and reset

Change the settings for managing your settings and data.

- **Back up my data**: Set to back up your settings and application data to the Google server.
- **Backup account**: Add and view your Google account to back up your data.



- Automatic restore: Set to restore your settings and application data when the applications are reinstalled on your device.
- Factory data reset: Reset your settings to the factory default values and delete all your data.

#### Date and time

Access and alter the following settings to control how time and date are displayed on your device.



If the battery remains fully discharged or removed from the device, the time and date will be reset.

- Automatic date and time: Automatically update the time when you set a time zone.
- Automatic time zone: Automatically update the time when you move across time zones.
- **Set date**: Set the current date manually.
- **Set time**: Set the current time manually.
- **Select time zone**: Set your home time zone.
- Use 24-hour format: Set to the time to be displayed in 24-hour format.
- Select date format: Select a date format.

## **Accessibility**

Change the settings for accessibility features.

- Services: Activate an accessibility application you have downloaded, such as Talkback or Kickback, which provide voice, melody, or vibration feedback.
- Power button ends call: Set the device to end a call when you press the Power/Lock key.
- Auto-rotate screen: Set whether or not to rotate the content automatically when the device is rotated.



- **Speak passwords**: Set the device to read aloud passwords you enter with TalkBack.
- **Tap and hold delay**: Set the recognition time for tapping and holding the screen.
- **Install web scripts**: Set applications to install web scripts to make their web content more accessible.

#### **Motion**

Change the settings that control motion recognition on your device.

- Motion activation: Set to use motion recognition.
- Tilt to zoom: Set to zoom in or out while viewing images in Gallery or browsing web pages when you tap and hold two points with your fingers and then tilt the device back and forth.
- Pan to edit: Set to move an item to another page when you tap and hold the item and then pan the device to the left or right.
- **Turn over to mute**: Set to mute incoming calls, alarms, and music by placing the device face down.

## **Developer options**

Change the settings for application development.

- **USB debugging**: Select to connect your device to a PC by using a USB cable.
- **Development device ID**: View your device's development ID.
- Allow mock locations: Allow mock locations and service information to be sent to a Location Manager service for testing.



- **Desktop backup password**: Set a password to secure your backup data.
- **Strict mode**: Set the device to flash the screen when applications perform long operations.
- **Pointer location**: Set to show the coordinates and traces of the pointer when you touch the screen.
- **Show touches**: Set to show the pointer when you touch the screen.
- **Show screen updates**: Set to flash areas of the screen when they are updated.
- Show CPU usage: Set to list all active processes.
- **Force GPU rendering**: Set to use 2D hardware acceleration to improve graphic performance.
- **Window animation scale**: Select a speed for opening and closing pop-up windows.
- **Transition animation scale**: Select a speed for switching between screens.
- **Don't keep activities**: Set to end a running application when you launch a new application.
- **Background process limit**: Set to limit the number of processes that can run in the background.
- **Show all ANRs**: Set the device to alert you to unresponsive applications that are running in the background.

## **About phone**

Access information about your device, check the device's status, and update the device system.



# **Troubleshooting**

# When you turn on your device or while you are using the device, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the device lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the device.
PIN	When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. You can disable this feature by using the <b>Lock SIM card</b> menu.
PUK	Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM or USIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

# Your device displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription.
   Contact your service provider for more details.

#### The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your device has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen.
   Protective covers may prevent the device from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

#### Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold the Power key for 8-10 seconds, and then release when the device vibrates. The device will reboot automatically.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. In Idle mode, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Back up and reset**  $\rightarrow$  **Factory data reset**  $\rightarrow$  **Reset device**  $\rightarrow$  **Erase everything**.

#### Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

## Outgoing calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.

## Incoming calls are not connected

- Ensure that your device is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

## Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

## Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the device's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

## When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

## The device beeps and the battery icon is empty

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the device.

# The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose
  of the old battery properly and replace it with a new
  battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal
  instructions).

#### Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

## Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile device must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Restart the device. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

## Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile device for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your device, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM-protected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your device supports the file type.

#### Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

# A connection is not established when you connect the device to a PC

- Ensure that the USB cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

# Safety precautions

To prevent injury to yourself and others or damage to your device, read all of the following information before using your device.

# Warning: Prevent electric shock, fire, and explosion

Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or loose electrical sockets

Do not touch the power cord with wet hands, or disconnect the charger by pulling on the cord

Do not bend or damage the power cord

Do not use your device while charging or touch your device with wet hands

Do not short-circuit the charger or the battery

Do not drop or cause an impact to the charger or the battery

Do not charge the battery with chargers that are not approved by the manufacturer

#### Do not use your device during a thunderstorm

Your device may malfunction and your risk of electric shock is increased.

#### Do not handle a damaged or leaking Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery

For safe disposal of your Li-Ion batteries, contact your nearest authorised service centre.

#### Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your device. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your device.
- Never dispose of batteries or devices in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries or devices.

- Never place batteries or devices on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

#### Protect the device, batteries, and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing your device and batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures.
- Extreme temperatures can cause the deformation of the device and reduce the charging capacity and life of your device and batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and – terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

# Caution: Follow all safety warnings and regulations when using your device in restricted areas

#### Turn off your device where prohibited

Comply with all regulations that restrict the use of a mobile device in a particular area.

#### Do not use your device near other electronic devices

Most electronic devices use radio frequency signals. Your device may interfere with other electronic devices.

### Do not use your device near a pacemaker

- Avoid using your device within a 15 cm range of a pacemaker if possible, as your device can interfere with the pacemaker.
- If you must use your device, keep it at least 15 cm away from the pacemaker.
- To minimise the possible interference with a pacemaker, use your device on the opposite side of your body from the pacemaker.

# Do not use your device in a hospital or near medical equipment that can be interfered with by radio frequency

If you personally use any medical equipment, contact the manufacturer of the equipment to ensure the safety of your equipment from radio frequency.



## If you are using a hearing aid, contact the manufacturer for information about radio interference

Some hearing aids may be interfered with by the radio frequency of your device. Contact the manufacturer to ensure the safety of your hearing aid.

#### Turn off the device in potentially explosive environments

- Turn off your device in potentially explosive environments instead of removing the battery.
- Always comply with regulations, instructions and signs in potentially explosive environments.
- Do not use your device at refuelling points (service stations), near fuels or chemicals, and at blasting areas.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the device, its parts, or accessories.

#### Turn off your device when in an aircraft

Using your device in an aircraft is illegal. Your device may interfere with the electronic navigation instruments of the aircraft.

# Electronic devices in a motor vehicle may malfunction due to the radio frequency of your device

Electronic devices in your car may malfunction due to radio frequency of your device. Contact the manufacturer for more information.

# Comply with all safety warnings and regulations regarding mobile device usage while operating a vehicle

While driving, safely operating the vehicle is your first responsibility. Never use your mobile device while driving, if it is prohibited by law. For your safety and the safety of others, practice good common sense and remember the following tips:

- Get to know your device and its convenience features, such as speed dial and redial. These features help you reduce the time needed to place or receive calls on your mobile device.
- Position your device within easy reach. Be able to access your wireless device
  without removing your eyes from the road. If you receive an incoming call at
  an inconvenient time, let your voice mail answer it for you.



- Suspend calls in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers. Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility of driving safely.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic. Place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when your car will be stationary.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road.
- Use your device to call for help. Dial a local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, or medical emergencies.
- Use your device to help others in emergencies. If you see an auto accident, a crime in progress, or a serious emergency where lives are in danger, call a local emergency number.
- Call roadside assistance or a special, non-emergency assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or another special, non-emergency number.

## Proper care and use of your mobile device

### Keep your device dry

- Humidity and all types of liquids may damage device parts or electronic circuits.
- Do not turn on your device if it is wet. If your device is already on, turn it off and remove the battery immediately (if the device will not turn off or you cannot remove the battery, leave it as-is). Then, dry the device with a towel and take it to a service centre.
- Liquids will change the colour of the label that indicates water damage inside the device. Water damage to your device can void your manufacturer's warranty.

## Do not use or store your device in areas with high concentrations of dust or airborne materials.

Dust or foreign materials can cause your device to malfunction and may result in fire or electric shock.

#### Do not store your device on slopes

If your device falls, it can be damaged.

# Do not store your device in hot or cold areas. It is recommended to use your device at temperatures from 5 °C to 35 °C

- Your device can explode if left inside a closed vehicle, as the inside temperature can reach up to 80 °C.
