






Chapter 1 - Before Using Blitz<sup>TM</sup>

### **KEYS DESCRIPTIONS**

The following list correlates to the previous page's phone illustration.

- 1. Display Screen: This screen displays all the information needed to operate your phone.
- **2.** [ ] **Left Soft Key:** Press to display the Message menu or access the function listed above the key.
- **3.** [ ] **SEND Key:** Press to make or receive a call. In standby mode, press to access your All Calls list.
- 5. [ ] Voicemail Key: Press and hold to automatically dial your voicemail system.
- **6. Dialing Keypad:** In idle mode, press to enter phone numbers.
- **7. Microphone:** Allows the other caller to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- "+". A"+" is reserved for international dialing code.

- **9.** [ ] **Vibrate Mode Key:** Press and hold to place your device in Vibrate mode.
- **10.** [ ok ] **Menu/OK Key:** Allows you to access the menu screen. It also allows you to accept choices when navigating through a menu.
- 11. [ ] My Messaging Key: Press to access the My Messaging
- **12. QWERTY Keyboard:** Press to enter numbers, letters, and characters using a full Qwerty keypad interface.
- 13. [ ] CLR/AVR Key: When entering a phone number or text, press to delete a single space or character. Press and hold to delete entire words. Press this key once in a menu to go back one level. In idle mode, press and hold to activate VoiceSignal<sup>TM</sup>. In WAP applications mode, press to retrieve the last URL, press and hold to retrieve the home page URL. During download mode, press to cancel the download.

- **14.** [ ] **I END Key:** Press to turn the phone on/off, end a call or browser session, and/or return to idle mode.
- **15.** [ ] **Right Soft Key:** Press to display Contacts or to access the function listed above the key.
- **16.** [ ] **Directional Key:** The Directional Key allows you to scroll through phone menu options and provides a shortcut to phone functions from standby mode. For more information on personalizing set shortcut keys, see "Set Shortcuts" on page 60.
- **17. Earpiece:** The earpiece allows you to hear the other caller.
- **18. Headset Jack:** Plug in the Headset Connector here to use a
- **19.** [ ] **Volume Keys:** Allows you to adjust the master volume in standby mode or adjust the voice volume during a call.
- **20. External Speaker:** Music, Ringtones, and Sounds are played through the speaker.

- 21. Self-Portrait Mirror: Displays your reflection when taking
- **22. Camera Lens:** The lens of your built-in camera.
- 23. Wrist Strap Eyelet: Accessory eyelet (optional straps and lanyards - purchased separately).
- **24. Charging / Data Jack:** Plug in the Wall Charger or USB Cable.
- **25.** [ ] **Music Key:** In idle mode, press to activate the Music player.
- **26.** [ ] Camera Key: Press to access Camera Viewfinder mode.
- **27.** microSD Card Slot: You can insert a microSD<sup>TM</sup> memory card here to increase memory capacity.

### **INSTALL BATTERY**

1. Remove the battery cover from the unit.



2. Slide the battery into the slot located at the bottom of the unit and press until you hear the "click".



### REMOVE BATTERY

1. To remove the battery, push down on the top of the battery while inserting your finger into the slot and pulling up from the back of the battery and slide it out.



2. Align the cover tabs with the slots at the top of the device and slide the battery cover back onto the unit.



If the battery is not correctly placed in the compartment, the handset will not turn on and/or the battery may detach during use.

### **CHARGING YOUR BATTERY**

1. To charge the phone, open the Charging/Data Jack cover on the Right Side of the phone, and connect the charger adapter. Plug the other end into a standard



2. To remove the adapter connection, squeeze the adapter's side buttons (1) and pull.





- When you charge the battery with the phone power off, you will see a charging status screen. You cannot operate the phone until it is powered on.
  - The battery is not fully charged at the time of purchase. Fully charge the battery before use.
  - It is more efficient to charge the battery with the handset powered off.
  - · Battery operating time gradually decreases over time.

  - If the battery fails to perform normally, you may need to replace the battery.

### BATTERY HANDLING INFORMATION

- Only use the battery and charger approved for use with the Blitz™.
- Only use the battery for its original purpose.
- Try to keep batteries in a temperature between 41 °F (5 °C) and 95 °F (35 °C). If the battery is stored in temperatures above or below the recommended range, give it time to warm up or cool down before using.
- Completely drain the battery before recharging.
- Store the discharged battery in a cool, dark, and dry place.
- Purchase a new battery when its operating time gradually decreases after fully charging.
- Properly dispose of the battery according to local laws.

### DON'TS

- Don't attempt to disassemble the battery it is a sealed unit with no serviceable
- Don't accidentally short circuit the battery by carrying it in your pocket or purse with other metallic objects such as coins, clips and pens. This may critically damage the battery.
- Don't leave the battery in extremely hot or cold temperatures. Otherwise, it could significantly reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery.
- Don't dispose of the battery by placing into a fire.

### TURNING THE PHONE ON/OFF

### TURNING THE PHONE ON

- 1. Press and hold the END Key until your display turns on and the tone sounds.
- If "Enter Lock Code" appears on the display, enter your 4-digit lock code to unlock
  - The default lock code is the last 4 digits of your Mobile Telephone Number.

### TURNING THE PHONE OFF

1. Press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press and hold the END Key until your display turns off.



- Immediately change or recharge the battery when "BATTERY LOW" appears on the display. Memory may possibly be damaged if the phone turns off due to the battery completely draining.
  - Turn the phone off before removing or replacing the battery. If the phone is on, unsaved data may be lost.

### **ACCESSING THE MENU**

Your phone can be customized via the menu. Each function can be accessed by scrolling with the Directional Key or by pressing the number that corresponds with the menu item.

- 1. To access the menu in idle mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the OK Key [MENU].
- 2. To scroll through the menu, press the Directional Key lown, left or right.
- current menu and return to the idle mode, press the END Key 🛭 .
- 4. In idle mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Left Soft Key [Message] to open the Messaging menu. Or, press the Right Soft Key [Contacts] to open your Contacts list.

All directions in this manual are based on the Tab Main Menu Setting, and Charming Display Theme, which are the default settings.

### **MAKING A CALL**

1. Slide out the QWERTY keyboard and from standby mode enter the phone number (include the area code if needed). Press the SEND Key



• To erase one digit at a time press the CLR Key



 When you place or receive a call from phone numbers stored in your contact list with a contact name, the name will be displayed.

2. To end a call, press the END Key ......



• You can also place calls using Voice-Activated Dialing. Please refer to page 74 for more details.

## **ANSWERING CALLS**

- 1. When your phone rings or vibrates, press the SEND Key 11 to answer the incoming call. (Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any key.)
- 2. To ignore incoming calls, press the Right Soft Key [Ignore].
- 3. To end a call, press the END Key 📗 .



In "Auto w/ Hands-free" a call is automatically answered after a preset number of ring tones (Refer to page 67).

### MISSED CALL NOTIFICATION

When an incoming call is not answered, the Missed Call logo appears on the display.

### TO DISPLAY THE MISSED CALL ENTRY FROM THE **NOTIFICATION SCREEN:**

- 1. Highlight the entry "View Now" and press the OK Key ......
- 2. To dial the phone number, press the SEND Key [

### TO DISPLAY A MISSED CALL ENTRY FROM STANDBY MODE:

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the OK Key [MENU], then press the Directional Key right once for the "RECENT CALLS" menu.
- 2. Slide out the OWERTY keyboard, and then press "1. Missed".
- 3. Highlight the entry you wish to view, then press the OK Key 🗪 [OPEN].
- 4. To dial the phone number, press the SEND Key [

### **WAIT/PAUSE FEATURE**

Pauses are used for automated systems (i.e., voice mail or calling cards). Insert a pause after a phone number and then enter another group of numbers. The second set of numbers is dialed automatically after the pause. This feature is useful for dialing into systems that require a code.

### Wait (W)

The phone stops dialing until you press the Left Soft Key [Release] to advance to the next number.

### 2-Sec Pause

The phone waits 2 seconds before sending the next string of digits automatically.

- Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and from standby mode enter the phone number.
- 2. Press the Right Soft Key [Options].
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to select pause type, then the OK Key (Nr. "2-Sec Pause/Wait".
- 4. Enter additional number(s) (pin number or credit card number).
- 5. Press the SEND Key to dial or the Left Soft Key [Save].

### **ANSWERING A CALL**

- If your phone is set to "Slide Open" for "Answer Options," simply open the phone to answer a call. If your phone is set to "Any Key" for "Answer Options," press any key to answer a call. If your phone is set to "Auto w/ Hands-free" for "Answer Options," calls are answered automatically with a 5 second delay. ("Auto w/ Hands-free" is available only when connected to a headset or handsfree device.) For information on how to set your Answer Options, see page 67.
- 2. To end the call, press the END Key .

## MAKING AN INTERNATIONAL CALL

- Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then press and hold the \* Key
   The + required for international calls will be displayed.
- 2. Enter the country code, area code, and phone number, then press the SEND Key ...
- 3. To end the call, press the END Key .

### 3-WAY CALLING

With 3-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be applied for each of the two calls.

- 1. Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then enter the phone number you wish to call and then press the SEND Key ...
- 2. Once you have established the connection, enter the second phone number you wish to call and then press the SEND Key [1] again.
- 3. When you're connected to the second party, press the SEND Key again to begin your 3-Way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three CALLS are disconnected.

### **CALL WAITING FUNCTION**

If you are on a call and you receive another incoming call, you will hear two beeps and the caller's phone number will appear on the display. With Call Waiting, you may put the active call on hold while you answer the other incoming call. To use Call Waiting:

To answer another call while on the phone, press the SEND Key
 This places the first call on hold. To switch back to the first caller, press the SEND Key again.

### **CALLING A NUMBER FROM CONTACTS**

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key ( [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key ( [Contacts].
- 2. Press the Directional Key up or down to select the Contact entry then press the OK Key (S) [VIEW].
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to select the phone
- 4. Press the SEND Key to place the call.

Pressing the Directional Key (a) up or down to select the "Contact entry" and then pressing the Send Key (a) will dial the Default Number of the Contact entry" automatically. If multiple numbers are saved in the "Contact entry", press the Directional Key (a) up or down to select the "Contact entry" and then press the Directional Key (b) left or right to select the number you want to dial. Then press the Send Key (a).

Chapter 2 - Basic Operation - Chapter 2

### ADJUSTING VOLUME

To adjust the master volume:

- 1. In idle mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Volume Keys up or down.
- 2. Select one of the following options and press the OK Key [SET] to save it.
  - All Sounds Off
  - Alarm Only
  - Vibrate Only
  - Low / Medium Low / Medium / Medium High / High



- Press the Volume Keys ¶ up or down to adjust Earpiece volume during a call.
  - To play a ringtone, press the Left Soft Key [Play].

### ADJUSTING THE CALL VOLUME

During a call, if you want to adjust the earpiece volume, press the Volume Keys up or down. Press the Volume Keys up to increase the volume level and the Volume Keys down to decrease the level. In Idle mode, you can also adjust the ringer volume by following the same steps.

### CALLER ID FUNCTION

Caller ID displays the number of the person calling when your phone rings. If the caller's identity is stored in Contacts, the name appears on the screen. The caller ID is stored in the Recent Calls Menu.

### **VIBRATE ON/OFF MODE**

Vibrate Mode mutes key tones and activates an alert for an incoming call or message. To activate Vibrate Mode:

- 1. From the idle screen, slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then press and hold the # Key 🛅 .
- 2. To return to a "Medium High" volume, from the idle screen press and hold the # Key 🛅 again.

### SPEAKERPHONE MODE

The Speakerphone feature lets you hear audio through the speaker and talk without holding the phone.

To activate the Speakerphone in idle mode or while on a call, press the Speakerphone Key 🔝 . If you press the Speakerphone Key 🔝 when you are not on a call, Speakerphone mode will be active for one minute, then turn itself off automatically.

### USING AUTO KEYPAD LOCK FUNCTION

When the Slide is closed, the Side Keys and the Directional Key are locked. To unlock them, press any key, "PRESS OK TO UNLOCK KEYPAD" displays, then press the OK Key [OK].

You can open the slide to unlock the keypad.

### **AVAILABLE OPTIONS DURING A CALL**

During a phone call, you can access the following features by pressing the Right Soft Key [Options]:

### MESSAGING

To access the Messaging Menu during a call:

1. Press the OK Key 属 [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Options], then slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and press "1. Messaging".

### CONTACT LIST

To view your Contact List during a call:

1. Press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Options], then slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and press "2. Contact List".

### RECENT CALLS

To view your Recent Calls list during a call:

1. Press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Options], then slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and press "3. Recent Calls".

### BLUETOOTH MENU

To access the Bluetooth Menu during a call:

1. Press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Options], then slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and press "4. Bluetooth Menu".

If an Audio device is connected, "Audio To Phone/Audio To Device" is displayed in the options menu instead of "Bluetooth Menu"

### MAIN MENU

To access the Main Menu during a call:

- 1. Press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Options], then slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and press "5. Main Menu".
- 2. Press the Directional Key up, down, left or right to scroll through the menu screens.

### NOTEPAD

To compose and send notes during a call:

1. Press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Options], then slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and press "6. Notepad".

### MAKING AN EMERGENCY CALL

The 911 feature automatically places the phone in the Emergency Call Mode when you dial the preprogrammed emergency number, 911. It also operates in Lock Mode and out of the service area.

### 911 IN LOCK MODE

To make an emergency call in Lock Mode:

- 1. Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then enter "911" and then press the SEND Key
- 2. The call connects.
- 3. The phone maintains the Emergency Mode for 5 minutes. When the call ends, the phone returns to Lock Mode.

### 911 USING ANY AVAILABLE SYSTEM

To make an Emergency Call using any available system:

- 1. Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then enter "911" and then press the SEND Key
- 2. The call connects.
- 3. The phone will stay in Emergency Mode for 5 minutes. While the phone is in the Emergency Mode for 5 minutes, the phone can receive an incoming call from any available system or you can make outgoing calls even in the Emergency Callback Mode. In this case, making a call can automatically end the Emergency Callback Mode.

The 911 call does not appear in the recent call list.

### NAMES TO BE DIALED

Allows you to dial the number associated with a specific word. For example, to call "1-800-FLOWER":

- 1. Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then enter "1-800" and then press and hold the Mode Change Key
- 2. Enter "FLOWER" with the OWERTY Keyboard and then press the SEND Key to connect.



• If Alphabet Mode icon is turned on only capital letters will be appeared.

• Pressing the Mode Change Key changes the display Number Mode icon to Alphabet Mode icon

### STORING A PHONE NUMBER

The Contact List stores up to 1000 entries.

### ADDING A NEW CONTACT

- 1. From standby mode slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then enter the phone number you want to save.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Save].
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to select "Add New Contact", then press the OK Key [OK].
- 4. Press the Directional Key up or down to select the type of phone number you want to save, then press the OK Key [OK]. Mobile 1/Mobile 2/Home/Work/Fax

Use Update Existing to add another phone number to a contact already stored in

- 5. Enter a name for the phone number (up to 32 characters), then press the OK Key 🗪 [SAVE].
- **6**. "CONTACT SAVED" displays, then the phone number reappears on the screen. Press the End Key 11 to exit, or press the Send Key 11 to call the number

Press the Right Soft Key [Options] to access the following

- . 2-Sec Pauce: Insert a 2-sec Pauce in the number
- . Wait: Insert a Wait pause in the number.
- New TXT Message: Send a text message to the contact.
- New Picture Message: Send a picture message to the contact.
- New Voice Message: Send a voice message to the contact.

### OPTIONS TO CUSTOMIZE YOUR CONTACTS

Once the basic phone number and name information is stored in your Contacts, you can edit and/or customize the entries.

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key 💌 [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Contacts], then press the Directional Key up or down to highlight the Contact entry you want to edit
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Edit] to access the Edit Contact screen.
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight the information field you want to customize. Additional fields include: Name/Mobile 1/Home/Work/E-mail 1/Group/Picture/Ringtone/ Mobile 2/Fax/E-mail 2

4. Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then change the data as necessary, then press the OK Key [SAVE] to save.

### ADDING OR CHANGING GROUPS

To organize your Contacts into groups:

- From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Contacts], then press the Directional Key up or down to highlight an entry.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Edit].
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight "Group" then press the Left Soft Key [Set].
- 4. Press the Directional Key up or down to select the Group, then press the OK Key [OK]. No Group/Family/Work

### CHANGING THE CALL RINGTONE

To identify who is calling by setting different ringtones for different phone numbers in your Contacts:

- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Edit].

- Press the Left Soft Key [ [Play] to listen to a highlighted ringtone before you press the OK Key [OK].
- 5. Press the OK Key [SAVE] to save.

### ADDING OR CHANGING THE PICTURE ID

To select a picture or graphic to assign to a Caller ID:

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Contacts], then press the Directional Key up or down to highlight an entry.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Edit].
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight "Picture", then press the Left Soft Key [Set].
- 4. Press the Directional Key 📵 up, down, left or right to select a picture, then press the OK Key [OK].
- 5. When completed, press the OK Key [SAVE].

### ADDING OR CHANGING AN EMAIL ADDRESS

To enter or add an Email address to a Contact entry:

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Contacts], then press the Directional Key up or down to highlight an entry.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Edit].

- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight "E-mail 1" or "F-mail 2".
- 4. Slide out the OWERTY keyboard, and then enter an Email address. then press the OK Key [SAVE] to save.

### ADDING A SPEED DIAL ENTRY

To add an entry to Speed Dial:

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Contacts], then press the Directional Key up or down to highlight an entry.
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Edit].
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight the phone number you want to add to Speed Dial, then press the Right Soft Key [Options].
- 4. Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then select "1. Set Speed Dial", then press the OK Key [OK].
- 5. Press the Directional Key up or down to select a Speed Dial location, then press the OK Key [SET].

- 6. Press the Directional Key up or down to select "Yes" to save, then press the OK Key [OK].
- 7. Press the OK Key [SAVE] to save.

### **EDITING CONTACTS ENTRIES**

### ADDING A PHONE NUMBER FROM THE STANDBY MODE

- 1. From standby mode slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then enter the phone number you want to save (up to 48 digits).
- 2. Press the Left Soft Key [Save].

### ADDING A PHONE NUMBER FROM THE CONTACT LIST SCREEN

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Contacts]. Your Contacts display alphabetically.
- 2. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight the Contact entry you want to edit, then press the Left Soft Key [Edit].
- 3. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight the phone number field you want to add, slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then enter the number, then press the OK Key 🔤 [SAVE] to save. A confirmation message appears.

### DEFAULT NUMBERS

The phone number saved when a Contact is created is the Default Number. If more than one number is saved in a Contact entry, another number can be set as the Default Number.

The Default Number cannot be deleted. The entire Contact entry can be deleted or another number can be assigned as the Default Number allowing you to delete the original number and keep the Contact entry.

### CHANGING THE DEFAULT NUMBER

- 1. From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the Right Soft Key [Contacts]. Your Contacts display alphabetically.
- 2. Press the Directional Key up or down to highlight the Contact entry you want to edit, then press the Left Soft Key [Edit].



Your device has dictionaries for English. The appropriate dictionary is activated automatically when you select a language on your device.



Your device uses the active dictionary to suggest corrections or complete the word you're typing.

### 1. [ ] Mode Change Key:

- When in idle mode:
- Slide out the QWERTY keyboard, and then press to change between entering numbers and letters that appear on the same key.
- Press and hold to lock in numeric mode or text entry mode.
- When in Text entry mode:
- Press to change between entering upper and lower case letters.
- Press and hold to lock in numeric or text entry mode.
- **2.** [ ] Word Change Key: When in text entry mode, press to select the next matching word.

- [Abc] input mode. [Abc], [ABC] and [abc] indicate the standard text input.

### THREE-TOUCH DIALING:

411 : Speed Dial entry 411 (Directory Assistance) is already assigned to Directory Assistance.

The update phone firmware (software) option allows you to download and update the software in your phone automatically. Only the internal software is updated; no Contacts entries or other information saved to your phone will be deleted.

#### STATUS

Check the latest Software Download/Update status.

 From standby mode, press the OK Key [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the OK Key [MENU], the Directional Key injent twice for SETTINGS & TOOLS, then slide out the QWERTY keyboard and press 9. Phone Info, 4. Software Update. Select "1. Status".

#### CHECK NOW

To check Download Server for new Software updates:

- From standby mode, press the OK Key [as [OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the OK Key [as [MENU], the Directional Key gright twice for SETTINGS & TOOLS, then slide out the QWERTY keyboard and press 9. Phone Info. 4. Software Update.
- 2. Select "2. Check Now".

#### **VOICE COMMANDS**

Your phone is equipped with an AVR (Advanced Voice Recognition) feature. This feature allows you to make calls or use the phone's functions by simply using your voice. All you have to do is talk into the phone, and the phone will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself.

- To access Voice Commands from standby mode, press the OK Key [SO] (OK] to unlock the keypad, then press the OK Key [SO] (MENU], the Directional Key [SO] right twice for SETTINGS & TOOLS, then slide out the OWERTY keyboard and press 2. Tools, 1. Voice Commands.
- Shortcut: In idle mode, press and hold the CLR Key lim to access the Voice Commands menu.
- The phone displays the Command menu and prompts you to say the name of the command you want to use. To complete your task, simply follow the voice prompts. You can speak the name of the command after you hear a been.
- You can hear a beep in the Tone Only Mode (Settings & Tools > Phone Settings > Voice Commands > Mode > Tones Only Mode) while you can see a prompt without a beep sound in the Prompt Mode or Readout Mode.

3. The View Contact page will be displayed for that contact name.

Use the Play command to playback one of the playlists, Say "PLAY" followed by a playlist and your phone will playback the recognized playlist for you.

#### SENSITIVITY

The Sensitivity setting controls how the voice recognition software determines when a spoken word is a match. If you frequently experience the messages "Please Repeat..." or "No Match Found," adjust the sensitivity toward Reject Less. If you frequently experience false activations (when the phone recognizes a name you didn't say), adjust the sensitivity toward Most Sensitive.

#### ADAPTATION

Voice Command is speaker independent, which means that no training or adaptation is required. Some users with heavy accents or unusual voice characteristics may find difficulty in achieving high accuracy with speaker independent Voice Command, so the Adapt Voice feature allows users to dramatically improve the recognition accuracy through adaptation. Users who get acceptable recognition accuracy will find no additional benefit to performing the Adapt Voice adaptaion.

#### USING THE microSD CARD


The microSD card stores sounds, images, photos and videos, music, and other files

The microSD card is sold separately, it does not come in-box.

#### INSTALLING THE microSD CARD

To install your microSD card:

- 1. With the microSD card slot opened and the gold contacts facing down, insert the microSD card into the slot
- 2. Push the card in until it clicks into place. "MEMORY CARD DETECTED" will appear on the display. Close the microSD card slot.



#### REMOVING THE microSD CARD

To remove the microSD card:

1. Open the microSD card slot. Use your thumb to press and release the microSD card.



It will pop-out to allow you to remove the card.

- Remove the card and close the microSD card slot
  - When you insert the microSD card, make sure contact terminals face down.
  - Do not remove the microSD card while reading or writing files. Otherwise it could be damaged

To ensure the proper function of removable memory, please use a microSD card.



#### EXPOSURE TO RADIO FREQUENCY SIGNALS

Your wireless handheld portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals.

In August 1996, the Federal Communications Commissions (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for handheld wireless phones. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies:

Those standards were based on comprehensive and periodic evaluations of the relevant scientific literature. #### ANTENNA SAFETY

Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damage the phone, or result in violation of FCC regulations. Please contact your local dealer for replacement

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF energy. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone. Therefore, use of your phone must be restricted in certain situations.

#### PACEMAKERS

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six (6") inches be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research. Persons with pacemakers:

- ALWAYS keep the phone more than six inches from your pacemaker when the phone is turned on.
- Do not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn your phone OFF immediately.

#### HEARING AIDS

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider (or call the customer service line to discuss alternatives).

#### OTHER MEDICAL DEVICES

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Turn your phone OFF in healthcare facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or healthcare facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

#### VEHICLES

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding

#### POSTED FACILITIES

Turn your phone OFF where posted notices so require.

#### AIRCRAFT

FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while in the air. Turn your phone OFF before boarding an aircraft. Always request and obtain prior consent and approval of an authorized airline representative before using your phone aboard an aircraft. Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radiofrequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on ratindards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. \* Tests for SAR are conducted with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the phone transmitting the same that the period power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the

network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 1.19 W/Kg and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.694 W/Kg. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and FCC requirements). While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

The SAR testing for Body-worn operation was performed with a belt clip that provided a 22mm separation. The User's Manual indicates that any holsters/clips used with this device should contain no metallic components.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. \* In the United States and Canada, the SAR limit for mobile phones used by the public is 1.6 watts/kg (W/kg) averaged over one gram of tissue. The standard incorporates a sub-stantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

# FCC HEARING-AID COMPATIBILITY (HAC) REGULATIONS FOR WIRELESS DEVICES

On July 10, 2003, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Report and Order in WT Docket 01-309 modified the exception of wireless phones under the Hearing Aid Compatibility Act of 1988 (HAC Act) to require digital wireless phones be compatible with hearing-aids. The intent of the HAC Act is to ensure reasonable access to telecommunications services for persons with hearing disabilities.

While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones, to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their how or a label located on the hox.

The ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interfer-

ence, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.



Hearing devices may also be rated. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you find this rating. Higher ratings mean that the hearing device is relatively immune to interference noise.

The hearing aid and wireless phone rating values are then added together. A sum of 5 is considered acceptable for normal use. A sum of 6 is considered for best use.

In the above example, if a hearing aid meets the M2 level rating and the wireless phone meets the M3 level rating, the sum of the two values equal M5. This should provide the hearing aid user with "normal usage" while using their hearing aid with the particular wireless phone. "Normal usage" in this context is defined as a signal quality that is acceptable for normal operation.

The M mark is intended to be synonymous with the U mark. The T mark is intended to be synonymous with the UT mark. The M and T marks are recommended by the Alliance for Telecommunications Industries Solutions (ATIS). The U and UT marks are referenced in Section 20.19 of the FCC Rules. The HAC rating and measurement procedure are described in the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) C63.19 standard.

CONSUMER UPDATE ON WIRELESS PHONES

#### 1. Do wireless phones pose a health hazard?

The available scientific evidence does not show that any health problems are associated with using wireless phones. There is no proof, however, that wireless phones are absolutely safe. Wireless phones emit low levels of radiofrequency energy (RF) are absolutely safe. Whereless phones emit low levels of radiofrequency energy (RF) in the microwave range while being used. They also emit very low levels of RF when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects. Many studies of low level RF exposures have not found any biological effects. Some studies have suggested that some biological effects may occur, but such findings have not been confirmed by additional research. In some cases, other researchers have had difficulty in reproducing those studies, or in determining the reasons for inconsistent results.

#### 2. What is FDA's role concerning the safety of wireless phones?

Under the law, FDA does not review the safety of radiation-emitting consumer products such as wireless phones before they can be sold, as it does with new drugs or medical devices. However, the agency has authority to take action if wireless phones are shown to emit radiofrequency energy (RF) at a level that is hazardous to

the user. In such a case, FDA could require the manufacturers of wireless phones to notify users of the health hazard and to repair, replace or recall the phones so that the hazard no longer exists. Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, FDA has urged the wireless phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support needed research into possible biological effects of RF of the type emitted by wireless phones:
- Design wireless phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user that is not necessary for device function;
- Cooperate in providing users of wireless phones with the best possible information on possible effects of wireless phone use on human health.

FDA belongs to an interagency working group of the federal agencies that have responsibility for different aspects of RF safety to ensure coordinated efforts at the federal level. The following agencies belong to this working group:

- National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health
- Environmental Protection Agency
- Federal Communications Commission
- Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- National Telecommunications and Information Administration

The National Institutes of Health participates in some inter-agency working group activities, as well. FDA shares regulatory responsibilities for wireless phones with the

Federal Communications Commission (FCC). All phones that are sold in the United States must comply with FCC safety guidelines that limit RF exposure. FCC relies on FDA and other health agencies for safety questions about wireless phones. FCC also regulates the base stations that the wireless phone networks rely upon. While these base stations operate at higher power than do the wireless phones themselves, the RF exposures that people get from these base stations are typically thousands of times lower than those they can get from wireless phones. Base stations are thus not the subject of the safety questions discussed in this document.

#### 3. What kinds of phones are the subject of this update?

The term "wireless phone" refers here to hand-held wireless phones with built-in antennas, often called "cell," "mobile," or "PCS" phones. These types of wireless phones can expose the user to measurable radiofrequency energy (RF) because of the short distance between the phone and the user's head. These RF exposures are limited by Federal Communications Commission safety guidelines that were developed with the advice of FDA and other federal health and safety agencies. When the phone is located at greater distances from the user, the exposure to RF is drastically lower because a person's RF exposure decreases rapidly with increasing distance from the source. The so-called "cordless phones," which have a base unit connected to the telephone wiring in a house, typically operate at far lower power levels, and thus produce RF exposures far below the FCC safety limits.

#### 4. What are the results of the research done already?

The research done thus far has produced conflicting results, and many studies have

suffered from flaws in their research methods. Animal experiments investigating the effects of radiofrequency energy (RF) exposures characteristic of wireless phones have yielded conflicting results that often cannot be repeated in other laboratories. A few animal studies, however, have suggested that low levels of RF could accelerate the development of cancer in laboratory animals.

However, many of the studies that showed increased tumor development used animals that had been genetically engineered or treated with cancer-causing chemicals so as to be predisposed to develop cancer in the absence of RF exposure. Other studies exposed the animals to RF for up to 22 hours per day. These conditions are not similar to the conditions under which people use wireless phones, so we don't know with certainty what the results of such studies mean for human health. Three large epidemiology studies have been published since December 2000. Between them, the studies investigated any possible association between the use of wireless phones and primary brain cancer, glioma, meningioma, or acoustic neu-roma, tumors of the brain or salivary gland, leukemia, or other cancers. None of the studies demonstrated the existence of any harmful health effects from wireless phone RF exposures. However, none of the studies can answer questions about long-term exposures, since the average period of phone use in these studies was around there years.

## 5. What research is needed to decide whether RF exposure from wireless phones poses a health risk?

A combination of laboratory studies and epidemiological studies of people actually

using wireless phones would provide some of the data that are needed. Lifetime animal exposure studies could be completed in a few years. However, very large numbers of animals would be needed to provide reliable proof of a cancer promoting effect if one exists. Epidemiological studies can provide data that is directly applicable to human populations, but 10 or more years' follow-up may be needed to provide answers about some health effects, such as cancer. This is because the interval between the time of exposure to a cancer-causing agent and the time tumors develop - if they do-may be many, many years. The interpretation of epidemiological studies is hampered by difficulties in measuring actual RF exposure during day-to-day use of wireless phones. Many factors affect this measurement, such as the angle at which the phone is held, or which model of phone is used.

#### 6. What is FDA doing to find out more about the possible health effects of wireless phone RF?

FDA is working with the U.S. National Toxicology Program and with groups of investigators around the world to ensure that high priority animal studies are conducted to address important questions about the effects of exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF). FDA has been a leading participant in the World Health Organization International Electromagnetic Fields (EMF) Project since its inception in 1996. An influential result of this work has been the development of a detailed agenda of research needs that has driven the establishment of new research programs around the world. The Project has also helped develop a series of public information documents on EMF issues. FDA and the Cellular Telecommunications & Internet Association (CTIA) have a formal Cooperative Research and Development Agreement

(CRADA) to do research on wireless phone safety. FDA provides the scientific oversight, obtaining input from experts in government, industry, and academic organizations. CTIA-funded research is conducted through contracts to independent investigators. The initial research will include both laboratory studies and studies of wireless phone users. The CRADA will also include a broad assessment of additional research needs in the context of the latest research developments around the world.

## 7. How can I find out how much radiofrequency energy exposure I can get by using my wireless phone?

All phones sold in the United States must comply with Federal Communications Commission (FCC) guidelines that limit radiofrequency energy (RF) exposures. FCC established these guidelines in consultation with FDA and the other federal health and safety agencies. The FCC limit for RF exposure from wireless telephones is set at a Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg). The FCC limit is consistent with the safety standards developed by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (IEEE) and the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement. The exposure limit takes into consideration the body's ability to remove heat from the tissues that absorb energy from the wireless phone and is set well below levels known to have effects. Manufacturers of wireless phones must report the RF exposure level for each model of phone to the FCC. The FCC website (http://www.fcc.gov/oet/rfsafety) gives directions for locating the FCC identification number on your phone so you can find your phone's RF exposure level in the online listing.

## 8. What has FDA done to measure the radiofrequency energy coming from wireless phones?

The Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) is developing a technical standard for measuring the radiofrequency energy (RF) exposure from wireless phones and other wireless handsets with the participation and leadership of FDA scientists and engineers. The standard, "Recommended Practice for Determining the Spatial-Peak Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) in the Human Body Due to Wireless Communications Devices: Experimental Techniques," sets forth the first consistent test methodology for measuring the rate at which RF is deposited in the heads of wireless phone users. The test method uses a tissue-simulating model of the human head. Standardized SAR test methodology is expected to greatly improve the consistency of measurements made at different laboratories on the same phone. SAR is the measurement of the amount of energy absorbed in tissue, either by the whole body or a small part of the body. It is measured in watts/kg (or milliwatts/g) of matter. This measurement is used to determine whether a wireless phone complies with safety ouidelines.

#### 9. What steps can I take to reduce my exposure to radiofrequency energy from my wireless phone?

If there is a risk from these products—and at this point we do not know that there is—it is probably very small. But if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF). Since time is a key factor in how much exposure a person receives, reducing the amount of time spent using a wireless phone will reduce RF exposure.

If you must conduct extended conversations by wireless phone every day, you
could place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, since the
exposure level drops off dramatically with distance.

For example, you could use a headset and carry the wireless phone away from your body or use a wireless phone connected to a remote antenna. Again, the scientific data do not demonstrate that wireless phones are harmful. But if you are concerned about the RF exposure from these products, you can use measures like those described above to reduce your RF exposure from wireless phone use.

#### 10. What about children using wireless phones?

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to users of wireless phones, including children and teenagers. If you want to take steps to lower exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF), the measures described above would apply to children and teenagers using wireless phones. Reducing the time of wireless phone use and increasing the distance between the user and the RF source will reduce RF exposure. Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all. For example, the government in the United Kingdom distributed leaflets containing such a recommendation in December 2000. They noted that no evidence exists that using a wireless phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit wireless phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

#### 11. What about wireless phone interference with medical equipment?

Radiofrequency energy (RF) from wireless phones can interact with some electronic devices. For this reason, FDA helped develop a detailed test method to measure electromagnetic interference (EMI) of implanted cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators from wireless telephones. This test method is now part of a standard sponsored by the Association for the Advancement of Medical instrumentation (AAMI). The final draft, a joint effort by FDA, medical device manufacturers, and many other groups, was completed in late 2000. This standard will allow manufacturers to ensure that cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators are safe from wireless phone EMI. FDA has tested hearing aids for interference from handheld wireless phones and helped develop a voluntary standard sponsored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). This standard specifies test methods and performance requirements for hearing aids and wireless phones so that that no interference occurs when a person uses a "compatible" phone and a "compatible" hearing aid at the same time. This standard was approved by the IEEE in 2000. FDA continues to monitor the use of wireless phones for possible interactions with other medical devices. Should harmful interference be found to occur. FDA will conduct testing to assess the interference and work to resolve the problem.

#### AVOID POTENTIAL HEARING LOSS.

Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cellular telephones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss. This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and other potential hearing problems varies.

The amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device, the device settings and the headphones. You should follow some commonsense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Set the volume in a guiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background environmental noise.
- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before your hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech or experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor


